MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

Madison Square Garden has now
become the center of the nation's
interest as the hosts of Democratic
Senators and Congressmen have
flocked to New York in a body, for
they will have a real voice in their
convention, something that their Re-
publican colleagues did not have at
Cleveland. One of their number, Sen-
ator Thomas J. Walsh of Montana,
the relentless oil investigator, is slated
to be permanent chairman of the
convention, and reports are also
heard here that Senator Pat Harrison
of Mississippi, the Democratic key-
note orator, may be the dark horse
who will get the Democratic presi-
dential nomination.

Democratic Senators who got to-
gether here to talk over the platform
plan on the League of Nations
found out that there would be a row
over this declaration before the plat-
form was finally adopted by the New
York convention. One faction, em-
bracing the so-called Wilsonian Dem-
ocrats, wanted a straight out and
pledge for American entrance into
the League of Nations, while the other
wanted a plank that would pledge
the party to work for world peace
and international understandings
without mentioning the League by
name. The platform discussions went
on here until 48 hours before the
time set for the opening of the con-
vention in New York.

CHINA QUESTION HARD ONE

Secretary of State Hughes is
stumped to know what to do about
China. Almost weekly he gets re-
ports of American citizens being
slain by bandits in that country,
and the protests of this Government
have passed almost unnoticed at Pe-
king. Now comes the crowning blow,
the Chinese Government having de-
nied that the United States has any
right in the Chinese Eastern Rail-
road, in which American investors
sunk \$5,000,000 shortly after the
war. China has turned the road over
to Russia and told the United
States that the American claims are
of no value. It is a perplexing prob-
lem, but at this writing it appears
that the five million is lost forever.
