

**ORDINANCE NO. 84**  
AN ORDINANCE to provide for the issuance of City of Vernonia Sewer Bonds in the sum of \$40,000; to provide a form for said bonds and the coupons attached thereto, ratifying, approving and confirming the sale of said bonds, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, heretofore at an election duly called and held in the City of Vernonia on the 24th day of April 1924, a charter amendment was duly adopted by the legal voters of said City authorizing the Council of said City to issue bonds of said City in the sum of \$40,000 for the purpose of procuring funds with which to install a sewerage disposal plant and outfall sewer for said City, and WHEREAS, it now becomes necessary to provide for the issuance of said bonds and a form therefor and for the coupons to be attached thereto; no, therefore,

**THE CITY OF VERNONIA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**  
Section 1. That the City of Vernonia do issue its bonds in the sum of \$40,000, said bonds to be in denominations of \$1000 each, numbered 1 to 40 inclusive, to bear the 1st day of August, 1924, and to mature the 1st day of August, 1934, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of February and August, principal and interest to be payable in United States gold coin of the present standard of value at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, said bonds to be signed by the Recorder under the corporate seal of said City, and the interest on said bonds to be represented by semi-annual interest coupons attached thereto bearing the engraved facsimile signatures of said Mayor and Recorder, which said bonds shall be known as "City of Vernonia Sewer Bonds."

Section 2. That the said City of Vernonia Sewer Bonds and the coupons thereto shall be in substantially the following form:

CITY OF VERNONIA, COLUMBIA COUNTY, OREGON, for value received, hereby promises to pay to bearer the sum of  
ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS  
on the 1st day of August, 1934, with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of six per cent (6) per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of February and August to the bearer of the respective coupons therefor hereto attached as they mature, both principal and interest, payable in United States gold coin of the present standard of value at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City.  
This bond is one of a series aggregating \$40,000 par value in amount of like date and tenor, numbered 1 to 40 inclusive, authorized and issued under and pursuant to the provisions of an amendment to the charter of said City submitted to and approved by the legal voters thereof at an election duly called and held therein on the 24th day of April, 1924, said series of bonds being issued for the purpose of procuring funds with which to construct and install a sewerage disposal plant and outfall sewers for said City.  
And it is hereby certified that every requirement of law relating to the issue hereof has been duly complied with and that this bond is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the constitution and laws of the State of Oregon or the charter of said City.  
And for the punctual payment of the principal hereof and the interest hereon the full faith and credit of the City of Vernonia is hereby irrevocably pledged.  
IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City of Vernonia has caused this bond to be signed by its Mayor and countersigned by its Recorder under the corporate seal of said City, and the annexed coupons to bear the engraved facsimile signatures of said Mayor and Recorder this 1st day of August, 1924.

Section 3. The sale of the aforesaid bonds heretofore made to Ek & Lund at the sum of par and accrued interest is hereby ratified, approved and confirmed and the proper city officials are hereby authorized and instructed to see to the proper execution of said bonds and to deliver thereof to said purchaser upon payment of the purchase price therefor.  
Section 4. WHEREAS, the bonds hereinabove provided for were duly authorized at an election regularly called and held for the purpose; and WHEREAS, it is necessary that funds be procured at as early a date as possible for the purpose of installing and constructing a sewerage disposal plant and outfall sewer for said city, thereby involving the peace, health and safety of the City, and in order so to do it is necessary to enact this ordinance; now, therefore,  
AN EMERGENCY is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into force and effect upon its adoption and approval.

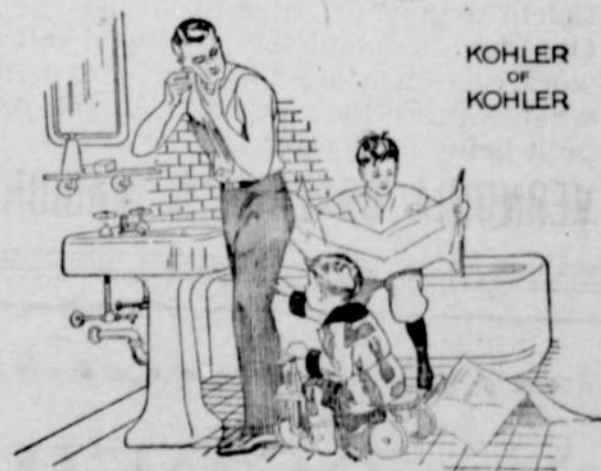
