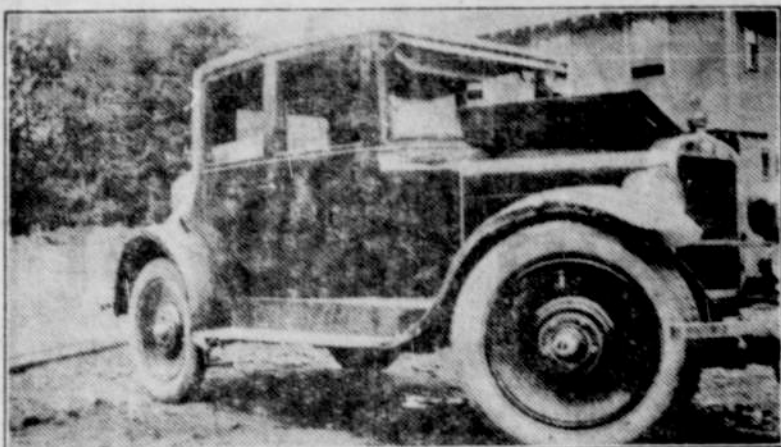




Above is a photograph taken of Oakland, which was purchased E. E. Hayes' Oakland 4 passenger through the Gilby Motor Co., at Ver-

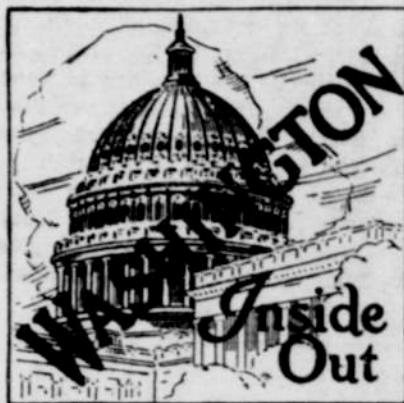

A Weekly Panorama of Events in the National Capital By Peter Keegan.

The administration's plunge into European affairs is causing widespread interest and comment following the successful conclusion of the London reparations conference. The United States is claiming much of the credit for the feeling of optimism and the bright outlook in Europe due to the fact it was a plan drafted by an American banker, General Dawes, upon which Europe is now basing her hopes for reconstruction economic improvement.

Division of the reparations which the allies expect to get out of Germany will be the subject of the next conference, to be held shortly in Paris. The United States will be officially represented in this parley as Germany owes this country more than a quarter of a billion dollars for the maintenance of the American Army of Occupation in Germany. An effort will be made at the Paris conference to work out a plan for the payments of this debt for German reparations.

The American people will be interested in the reparations settlement, too, to the extent of about \$175,000,000, which is to be contributed by American bankers toward German reconstruction by buying bonds of the new German bank to be created under the Dawes plan. Most of this loan is expected to be covered in this country by the J. P. Morgan company of New York, but the administration has urged the people generally to subscribe and a general offering of the German securities may be made in this country.

Every member of the Cabinet will take the stump before the campaign is over in the intrats of Mr. Coolidges candidacy—every member except Secretary of the Treasury Mellon, who has never made a speech in his life and has informed the Republican National Committee that it is too late for him to start now. Mellon's accomplishments as Secretary of the Treasury will be one of the GOP's big talking points in the campaign, however, even if Mellon won't take the stump himself, to tell about it.

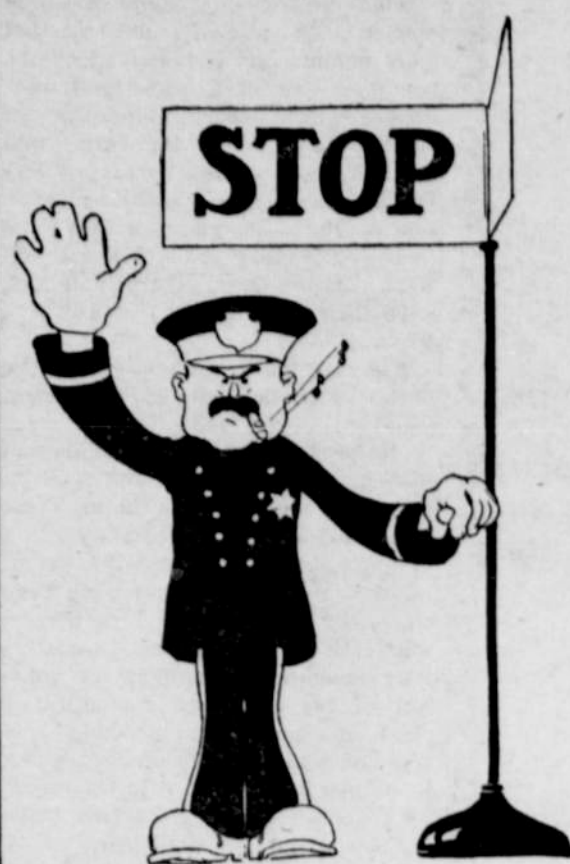

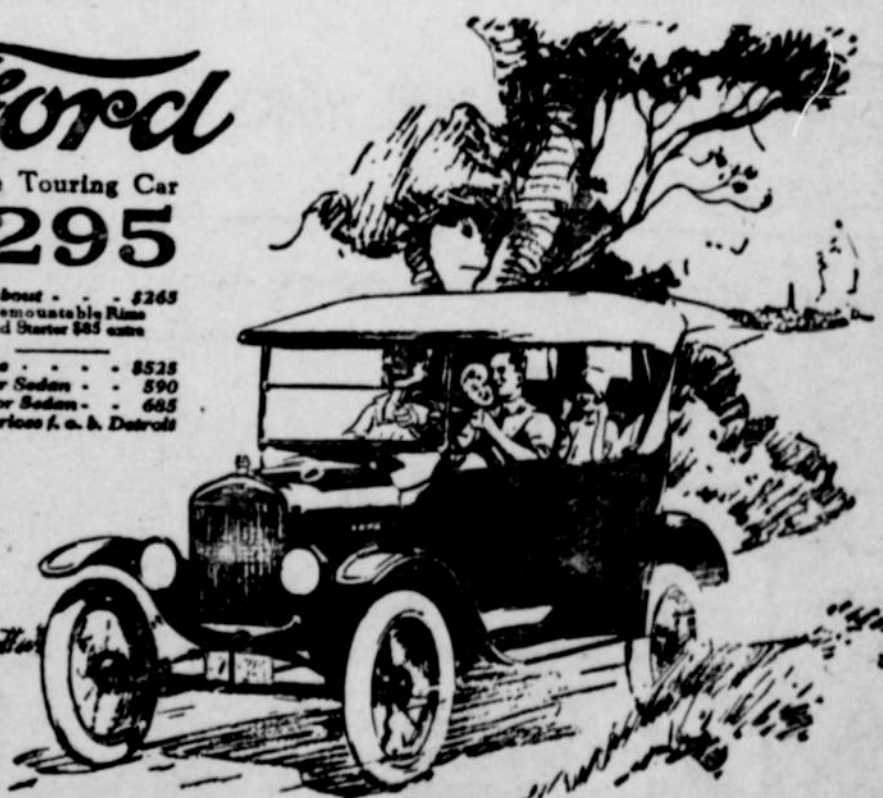
