Could Oklahoma City, Dallas, St. Louis or any other city have reached its present size without the favorable publicity given them by their great papers?

If the home merchants did not get a bit of return in the way of increased business from their support of the home town paper they could afford to support their paper because of the benefits their town receives from a good home paper.

The home paper is the mirror of the mercantile life of a town. If your home paper is a small sheet with little news and few ads poorly displayed and poorly set up, you will know that the paper comes from a dead town.

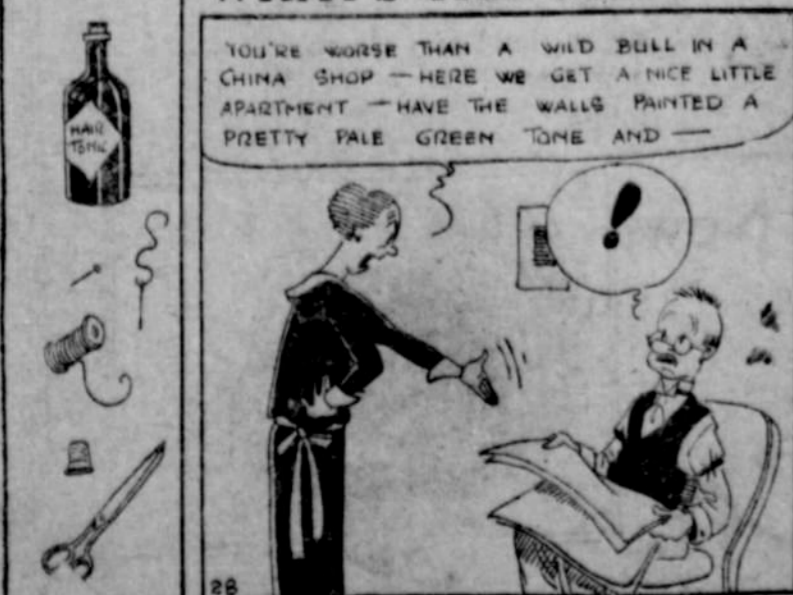
