OREGON LEADS WORLD IN TIMBER WEALTH

California Takes Second With Washington a Close Third.

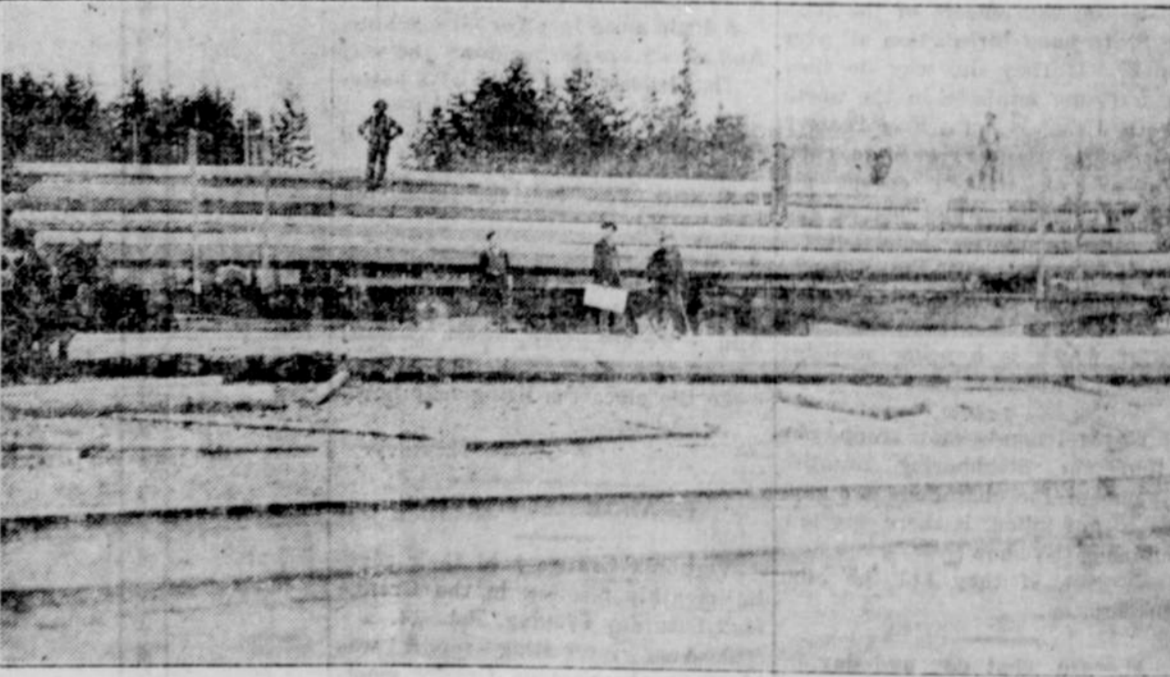
Three hundred ninety-five billion, seven hundred seventy six million, two hundred and twenty-nine thousand feet is the estimate amount of timber that remains uncut in the State of Oregon which is distributed over 19,000,000 acres of forest land in this state.

California has 284,505,000,000 feet of timber over a forest area of 15,032,032,000 acres of land.

The State of Washington ranks a close third with almost as much standing timber as the two leading states.

The above figures were prepared by the California State Forester M. B. Pratt, who stated that this places California as having the second largest timber area and resources of any locality in the world with Oregon ranking first.
