 public will pay any attention to it.

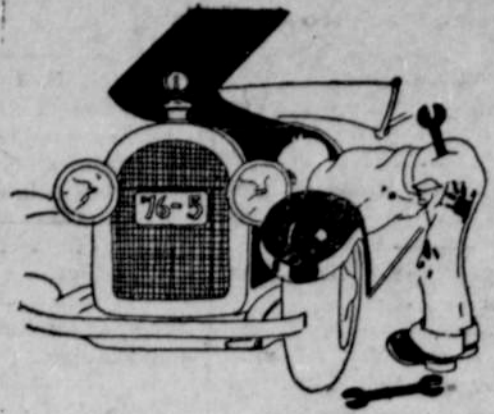
An efficiency expert is a man who
