Editorial

The state legislature passed the bill which permits counties to grant franchises for toll roads, which was enacted especially to meet a situation in Tillamook, Washington and Yamhill counties in the building of a road either over the Wilson or Trask roads.

Judge Philip was visitor to the Vernonia C. of C. luncheon Monday. The Judge gave an optimistic talk on conditions of the Columbia River side of our county, saying that the new million dollar paper mill to build at St. Helens would bring other industries and perhaps another saw mill; saying also that the iron deposits near Scappoose would soon be developed, smelting being done by electricity; and further declaring that oil indications near Scappoose were very gratifying.

The bill introduced at the request of the Oreon Humane Society, making it unlawful to carry a dog on the running board or fender of an automobile without some proper form of rack or carrier, was voted down in the house. We think it was a good law and it was a mistake that it did not become a law.

The Christian Endeavors of the World will start their big Interantional Convention in Portland on the Fourth of July to continue a week. Among world-known men to attend will be David Lloyd George—Ex-british Premier.

C. W. REITHNER WILL LEAVE FOR OREGON

C. W. Reithner, who for many years was one of Deer River's leading business men, is loading his household goods today for shipment to Vernonia, Ore., where he plans to engage in business. Mr. Reithner will go some day next week.

"Carl" Reithner has been identified with the business life of Deer River for over a score of years. He came here in 1904, and was first employed in Tuller's store. On Sept. 29, 1906, Mr. Reithner and his partner F. E. Betz, opened their store on what is now the site of the Lyceum Theatre. Four years later the firm moved to the corner now occupied by the Alva A. Baker hardware. In 1915, Mr. Reithner assumed the interest of his partner, and two years later moved to the Brooks building opposite the Great Northern station. He was in business there until October, 1922.

Mr. Reithner is a substantial business man, whose removal from Deer River will be generally regretted. He has always been loyal to the best interests of this village. In business he enjoyed a large trade, built up by courteous treatment and honest dealing. When he retired two years ago, it was hoped that he would again go into business here. It is with much genuine regret that his friends learn of his leaving.

Mr. Reithner has been an active member of the local commercial club and served on the village council for a number of years. His friends trusted his confidence and his integrity. He could always be depended upon to serve the best interests of the community.

This is not Mr. Reithner's obituary. He is far from a dead one, who will be greatly missed here from the councils of the community. Deer River is open to him for return at any time, yet the best wishes of a host of friends go with him to his new location.
