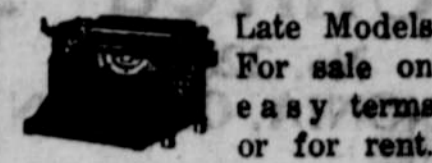

The Children Get a Better Deal

Among the greatest benefactors of prohibition have been the children of the nation.

The passing of the saloon has meant not only increased savings but a corresponding increase of food, clothing, happiness and protection for the little ones in many homes.

Statistics can never tell the children's story of prohibition blessings, but the facts presented in Collier's (of recent date) carry with them a significance.

According to the writer, "The New York Children's Court reports an average per year of 3,006 fewer delinquent and neglected children during 1922-24 than during the ten years, 1912-21.

"Chicago had 5,238 such cases in 1919 and 3,850 in 1923, which last was not as prosperous as 1919 was.

"Massachusetts reports an average decrease during the five years, 1920-24 of thirty per cent in criminally 'tough kids.' 'The state's prison' has fallen off one-half since 1910," says Sanford Bates, Commissioner of Correction.

"Give probation and charity and social effort all the credits you like," continues the writer, "but had scarce booze nothing to do with it. The children and the children's children will tell the story."

Operations of Former Distilleries More Profitable Than for Liqueur Manufacture

One by one the Central Illinois distilleries, which were ranked as the largest in the world, have been changed into manufacture of food and the various by-products of grain according to the Chicago Daily News. These were believed to have been doomed with the adoption of the Eighteenth Amendment, but instead, more men are being employed and with a much larger pay roll than during the days before the Volsted Act.

Prohibition's predicted "economic blight" on Central Illinois did not materialize. The suspension of the great distilleries has meant simply their transformation into other industrial plants. Where in the past train-loads of whiskey were shipped to all parts of the Union and countries of the globe, there are now moving out even greater train-loads of foodstuffs, commercial alcohol, cracked corn, silvents and the like.

School Children's Posters Arouse Interest in Prohibition

"Where there's a will there's a way" for any individual, though single-handed, to conduct a prohibition contest in a school. In a certain little village where the W.C.T.U. is not organized, a wide-awake woman belongs to a union several miles away. As an aid to the cause, she offered the school children three prizes for the three best prohibition posters. The result was very gratifying. About twenty were submitted, all of them so good that it was difficult to tell which was the best. The largest was eighteen by twelve inches, the smallest fourteen by ten. The children pasted on blank sheets of heavy paper, or cardboard, pictures cut from magazines, ransacking for the purpose their own homes and those of neighbors. The whole district became stirred up over the contest and every one evidenced more or less interest.

Let me describe two of the posters, though they were no better than some others. The first showed on a white background a blue picture of a Dutch village with the old Dutch Cleanser woman by the dozens with same club. Under the picture was for led, "Driving Liquor Out of the..." Another poster represented a man sitting in the road near a car, for he had been smashed against a stone home pole. This pointed companion accompanied the drawing: "I clerk my car until I took a drink. E then my car drove me." F R ter an evening at the school.
