BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUN-  
CIL OF THE CITY OF VERNONIA,  
COLUMBIA COUNTY, ORE-  
GON,

That the following proposed  
amendments to the charter of said  
City be and the same hereby are  
proposed for submission to the legal  
voters of said City for their adoption  
or rejection at a special city election  
hereby and herein called to be held  
in said City on the 23rd day of  
March, 1925.

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUB-  
MITTED TO THE VOTERS  
BY THE COUNCIL

An Act  
To amend an Act entitled "An Act  
to incorporate the City of Vernonia,  
in the County of Columbia, State of  
Oregon," filed in the office of the  
Secretary of State February 18th,  
1891, as amended at an election held  
on the 7th day of November, 1922,  
by a vote of the people, and to  
amend all other amendments thereto  
enacted by the Legislative Assembly  
or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE  
OF THE CITY OF VERNONIA

That an Act entitled "An Act to in-  
corporate the City of Vernonia, in  
the County of Columbia, State of  
Oregon," filed in the offices of Sec-  
retary of State, February 18th, 1891,  
as amended at an election held on  
the 7th day of November, 1922, by a  
vote of the people, and as amended  
by all other amendments thereto en-  
acted by the Legislative Assembly  
or by vote of the people, be and the  
same hereby is amended by adding  
thereto Chapter XIV to read as fol-  
lows:

CHAPTER XIV  
Section 1. For the purpose of  
procuring funds with which to pay  
for the improvement of street inter-  
sections, which has been or shall be  
ordered paid out of the General  
Fund by the Council, the Council of  
the City of Vernonia is hereby  
authorized and empowered to  
issue general obligation bonds of  
the City in the sum of  
\$6000.00, said bonds to bear date

and mature as determined by the  
Council, but shall mature within  
twenty years from date, to bear in-  
terest at not to exceed six (6) per  
cent per annum, payable semi-annu-  
ally, each of said bonds to be a  
direct general obligation of the City  
of Vernonia and to be known as  
"City of Vernonia General Obligation  
Bonds."

Section 2. The debt limitations  
contained in the Charter of said  
City shall not apply to the bonds  
hereby authorized.

Section 3. The Council shall  
each year at the time of making the  
annual tax levy for city purposes  
included in such levy a sum sufficient  
to pay interest due on the outstand-  
ing bonds of this issue and to retire  
the principal thereof at maturity.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that this  
resolution for proposed charter  
amendments submitted to the voters  
by the Council be filed with the Re-  
corder of the City of Vernonia for  
submission to the legal voters of said  
City for their rejection or approval  
to be voted upon at a special election  
to be held as herein provided.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the  
Council deems it advisable and does  
hereby and herein call and make  
necessary provisions for the holding  
of a special election which shall be  
and hereby is called to be held on  
the 23rd day of March, 1925, be-  
tween the legal voting hours on said,  
date, and that said time be and the  
same hereby designated as the time  
for holding said special election, and  
the City Hall in said City is hereby  
designated as the polling place there-  
for, and the following named per-  
sons are hereby designated and ap-  
pointed as and for the judges and  
clerks of said election, to-wit:

E. E. Marsh, Tom Shock and Ray  
F Reasoner, judges; and Mrs. E. E.  
Marsh and Mrs. W. A. Harris, clerks.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that for  
the hereinabove proposed charter  
amendments the following ballot  
title be and the same hereby is  
adopted:

CHARTER AMENDMENTS  
SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS  
BY THE COUNCIL

An Act  
To amend the charter of the City  
of Vernonia, filed in the office of the  
Secretary of State, February 18,  
1891, as amended by the people at  
an election held November 7, 1922,  
and to amend all other amendments  
thereto, by adding Chapter XIV,  
providing for the issuance of \$6000-  
00 bonds to pay for the cost of im-  
proving street intersections in said  
city, providing for the levy of a  
special tax to pay principal and in-

terest thereon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,  
That the Recorder be and he is here-  
by instructed to publish the herein-  
above proposed charter amendments  
submitted to the voters by the Coun-  
cil in the manner provided by law;  
that is to say, by publication of this  
resolution in full in Vernonia Eagle,  
a newspaper published in the City of  
Vernonia, Oregon, and hereby design-  
ated for the purpose, in at least  
one issue thereof not less than ten  
(10) days, nor more than twenty  
(20) days, immediately preceding  
the date of said special election.
