VERNONIA ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION ORGANIZED AND READY TO GO

This will be an active year in Vernonia Athletic lines. Be it known that with the only exception of Portland, Vernonia has the best ball park in Oregon, and the grounds are in splendid condition for the season. It is hoped we can have an "All Home Team," this year, and much interest is now being shown in the work of team organizing. The Association held their Annual Meeting last Monday, at which time the following directors were elected: C. R. Coyle, A. L. Kullander, J. H. Bush, C. D. White, C. C. Brown.

Stayton—Santiam Cheese company has made 63,000 pounds of cheese in seven months. Product for 19-25 will be larger.

Medford—New sand and gravel company will spend \$10,000 to develop gravel plant.

Lone—Hotel Lone being rebuilt and modernized.

Oregon City—Postal receipts for 1924 show 19.4 per cent gain over 1923.

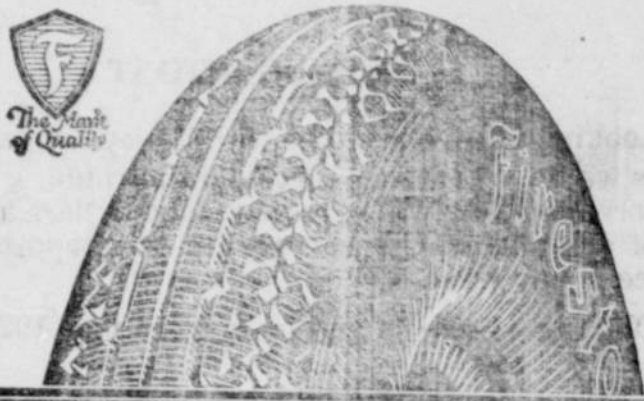
Lone—Machinery on way to start prospect well for oil here. Three test holes to be drilled, starting Mar. 1st.

Roseburg—Building in sight for 1925 already aggregates \$500,000. Principal activity will be in business structures.

Klamath Falls, Klamath Falls building for 1924 was 343 per cent above 1923 record, and 460 per cent above 1922. Total for 1924 was \$1,28,779.

Eugene—Total of 663 buildings costing \$2,714,715 in 1924, was 138 per cent over 1923 and 183 per cent over 1922 records.

The world crop of wheat for 1924 is estimated to be 440,000,000 bushels short, and the total rye crop is 320,000,000 bushels short of the 1923 yield of 1,494, 638,000 bushels.
