

700,000 LEAFLETS FOR CORRESPONDENCE

The Northern Pacific railway will distribute 175,000 leaflets, giving a summary of the attractions and opportunities offered by the state, and the other railroads about the same number, in their correspondence for the entire month. These leaflets are being supplied by the Portland and other Chambers of Commerce in Oregon, in addition to 200,000 which will be distributed by the local business men of the state in their correspondence. Window displays will be used in all the principal ticket office of the three lines, in eastern states.

Ans.—William McKinley was shot while holding a reception at the Pan-American exposition at Buffalo, N. Y. on Friday, Sept. 1, 1901, by Leon Czolgosz, and died eight days later from the effects of the shot—Sept. 10. The assassin who was an Athiest, was electrified at the Auburn, New York state prison on Oct. 29, 1901.

Ans.—The flag of Germany since the fall of the monarchy is black, red and gold. These colors were adopted when the republic was established.
