 To Clear, Grade and Grub the
 Pettijohn-Keasey Road according to
 plans and specifications, from Sta-
 tion 23x50 or the Southerly end of
 the Rock Creek Bridge to station
 66x10 at the Portland, Astoria &
 Pacific Railway Bridge Easterly from
 Keasey, located in Section 32, T.
 5 N. R. 5W. W.M. and Section 5, T.
 4 N. R. 5 W.
 will be received by said county
 Court until 10:00 o'clock a. m., Sat-
