PREPARE GROUND NOW FOR ALFALFA

By GEO. A. NELSON County Agriculturist The ground that is to be planted to alfalfa should now be gotten in good condition for this spring's planting. By getting the ground in good shape at this time of year and working it occasionally the weeds and grass can be killed, so that the ground will be much cleaner at planting time.

The practices followed so far have shown that about the best time to sow is during the month of May and as late as the first of June. Having the ground clean and free of weeds is more important than having plenty of moisture in the early spring. Alfalfa is a dry land plant and will grow with a limited amount of moisture.

In selecting ground for the growing of alfalfa be sure that it is well drained as alfalfa will not grow in a wet soil. The ground selected should be an open soil with a well drained subsoil.

It will be remembered that a few years ago great concern was expressed because of the loss to hotels of the revenue derived from bars. It was insisted by some that these great institutions could not long survive under prohibition. Chairman Flowe of the American Hotel Association educational committee says that three-fourths of the hotel owners in America would oppose any breakdown of the Volstead Act because prohibition has lifted them from the level of the saloonist into the realm of legitimate business. He cites the fact that new hotels costing \$250,000,000 are being built today. - Oregon Grange Bulletin.

FARM POINTERS

Dry Rot Has Cause Dry rot, to which apples are peculiarly susceptible, has been nearly always connected with lack of moisture in the late summer. In Oregon there is sufficient moisture in the soil in the spring to develop a good growth on the tree. Shallow soils due to the presence of hard pan or a high water table prevent the roots from going deeply into the soil. Sufficient moisture for the surface roots cannot be held late into the summer. As a result this vigorous growth is likely to draw moisture not only from all the tree and roots, but directly out of the fruit, causing it to develop this interior browning, or so-called dry rot.

Larger Heads, Need

It is important not only that economical production in Oregon be attained through the use of economical rations, but that high producing cows be kept in large enough units to keep down overhead expense, states Prof. P. M. Brandt, chief of the dairy husbandry department at the state agricultural college. He suggests paying more attention to irrigated pasture and to roughage such as alfalfa hay as sources of cheap dairy feed. Cost of production studies have shown that it is not sufficient to have high producing cows, but they should be kept in units of not less than 10 per herd to get the greatest economy in production and the highest quality of product.

Chicks Need Room

Use the brooder house only while chicks are being brooded, advises H. E. Cosby, poultry specialist for the O. A. C. extension service. There isn't enough room or fresh air in a 10 feet by 12 feet portable brooder for 200 pullets until they are grown and a 16 foot by 32 foot type brooder house cannot satisfactorily handle from 700 to 800 pullets.

After chicks no longer need artificial heat and when they are on temporary roosts the pullets should be taken out of the brooder house and transferred to other houses out on free range.

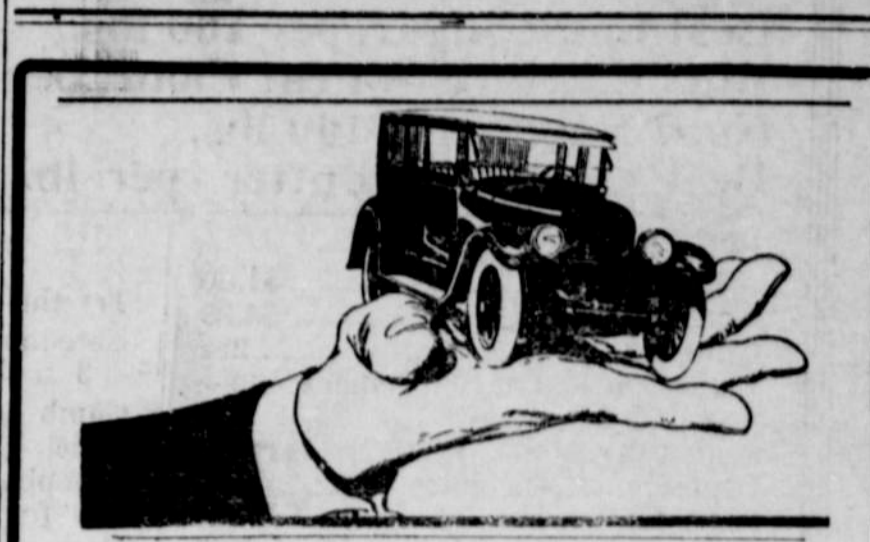
