WAR VETERAN GETS NEEDED HELP

Tillamook, Ore.—John Burkhardt got two visits to the mill here the other day. One is regular, he said. The other is a doctor to tell how the American Legion helped him when the black shingles of his back engulfed him, and in the falling process did in constituting the American Legion Headquarters fund which will make possible the construction of the Legion's program to "enable the disabled war veterans" and their dependent children.

"Regarding my father," John wrote to the American Legion, "I am handicapped with that I could be as well as the majority of fellows, but, you know, we have had the machine until it came."

John was hospitalized after his war service in February, 1919, and worked in an office in Toppenish, Wash., until March, 1920, when he was forced to go to his home in Payton, Wash., a distance of 100 miles. The following day he entered the government hospital at Walla Walla. He stayed there a month and was told he had to change to recover.

"Not making what the Veterans' Bureau man, I left the hospital," he said. He went to Tillamook the following year to work, but became helpless after a few months, almost physically and mentally.

The American Legion took up the case, and with the cooperation of government agencies a clinic was put through for John while stay days. He was again sent to the hospital at Walla Walla. Work, nervous and hounded, the boy again returned home, where he was confined to his bed for several months. The compensation was not large enough to support him, and again the American Legion took up the case. His insurance had been dropped. Again the government agencies cooperated with the Legion in obtaining a perma-

ent and total disability rating for the boy who cannot get well.
