from the East end of Railroad culvert on Lot 4, Block 6, Rose addition to Vernonia, to Rock Creek, to serve as a Storm Sewer and to diverge Bear Creek from private property. The Engineer's estimate of the probable cost of said improvement, as shown by the files of the Recorder, is \$1715.84, for the Cougar Street improvement, and \$4975.40 for the Maple Street improvement. The district liable to be assessed for the aforesaid improvement shall be known as Improvement District No. 10, and is described as follows: Beginning at the northeast corner of Lot 5, Block 1, Evergreen Park Addition to the City of Vernonia, Oregon, said point being on the section line and 640 feet, more or less, north of the quarter section corner on the west side of section 4, township 4, north, range 4, west Willamette Meridian; thence west 75 feet, more or less, to the northwest corner of said lot thence southerly on east line of Weed Ave., 338 feet, more or less, thence north 327 feet, more or less, to the east line of Rose Ave., thence north 60 feet, thence west 200 feet to the southwest corner of Lot 4, Block 8, Central Addition to Vernonia; thence north 50 feet, thence west 125 feet, thence north 50 feet, thence west 260 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 10, Block 7, Central Addition; thence north 100 feet, thence west on the south line of Nehalem Street 296 feet, more or less, to the City Limits of Vernonia; thence following said city limits on Third Ave., south 1860 feet, more or less; thence east between Lots 6 and 7, Block 6, Park Addition to Vernonia, 130 feet, more or less to the northeast corner of said Lot 6, thence south 80 feet, more or less, to the city limits of Vernonia; thence east on said city limits 775 feet, more or less, to the center of the United Railway's Co's., right of way, thence following center of said right of way, 60 feet in width, in a northeasterly direction 400 feet, more or less, to the line between Lot 4 and Lot 5, Block 8, Rose Addition produced west; thence east following said line and the center line of Delta Land and Timber Co's railroad, 1000 feet, more or less, to a point 15 feet east of the southeast corner of Lot 4, Block 18, in Vernonia, thence north 200 feet to the south line of Cougar street, thence east 145 feet, thence north 50 feet thence east 145 feet to the southeast corner of Lot 5, Block 10, Vernonia, thence north 200 feet to the northeast corner of Lot 2, in said Block 10, thence east 60 feet, more or less, to the west bank of Rock Creek, thence northerly following the same, 390 feet, more or less, to the center line of Bridge street thence north forty-five degrees, west 204 feet, more or less, to a point 170 feet north of the northwest corner of Lot 1, Block 9, in Vernonia; thence west 190 feet, thence north 40 feet to the northeast corner of Lot 3, Block 1, of Vernonia, thence northwesterly 124 feet, more or less, to the northwest corner of Lot 2 in said Block 1, thence north 50 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 1 in said block, thence northwesterly 690 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning. Provided that all properties lying west of the center line of the United Railway's Co's right of way, in above described district, shall be assessed not to exceed \$3.00 per 50x100 foot lot, to be applied on the construction of said Maple Street Storm Sewer outlet only. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Recorder do give notice of the passage of this resolution by causing the same to be published in two consecutive issues of the Vernonia Eagle, a newspaper published in Columbia County. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that objections and remonstrances may be filed with the Recorder against the proposed improvement at any time within twenty (20) days after the first publication of this resolution, and the same will be heard and considered by the Council at its first regular meeting subsequent to the expiration of said twenty (20) days. WHEREAS it is necessary that the aforesaid improvement be made at as early a date as possible on account of the necessity for the completion thereof before the bad weather commences and it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the City of Vernonia that said improvement be made in the immediate future. NOW, THEREFORE, An Emergency is declared to exist and this resolution shall go into force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval. ARMY RECRUITING OPEN TO YOUNG MEN
A recruiting party from the U. S. Army Recruiting station in Portland will be in Astoria on recruiting duty from June 8th to 13th inclusive, and will be authorized to accept qualified applicants for the Infantry and Field Artillery for service in the Hawaiian Islands, Infantry, Engineers, Coast Artillery and Quartermaster Corps, 2nd Corps Area, New York, New Jersey and Delaware. Infantry, Alaska, field artillery, cavalry and engineers, 8th corps area, (Texas and Oklahoma), infantry, engineers, field artillery and quartermaster corps, (mechanics and motor vehicle drivers), Camp Lewis, Wash, infantry, Fort Lawton, Fort Wright and Vancouver Barracks, Wash., infantry, medical department and signal corps, (radio operators), Presidio of San Francisco, Calif., and several other places on the Pacific coast. Qualified applicants with or without prior service are eligible for enlistment for any of the above branches and stations. There are also a number of vacancies in army lands, in which a soldier has an excellent opportunity to become a proficient musician, under some of the best musical instructors in the United States.
