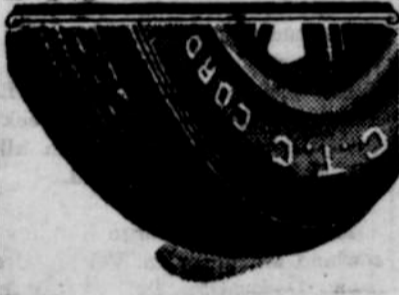
GUERNSEY BREEDERS TAKE EXCURSION

The Guernsey breeders excursion was held last Saturday in which a caravan of Guernsey admirers toured Columbia county from Marshland to Warren, visiting the principal herds in the vicinity of Marshland, Goble, Clatskanie, Beaver Valley, Deer Island and Warren. It was a pleasant and profitable trip for all. The Guernseys are one of the newer dairy breeds of the county, but quite a number of dairy men are making substantial progress in building up some good grade and pure bred herds. Quite a number of the Guernsey breeders have added one or more pure bred females to their herds, so as to be able to work into a pure bred herd. The two largest herds in the county are those of Mr. J. T. Graham of Marshland, who has a herd of about twenty pure bred Guernsey cows, and Mr. John Farr of Warren, who has about the same number of grade and pure bred cows. The Guernsey breeders were also interested in inspecting Mr. Farr's new barn which is built on modern plans. A very enjoyable picnic luncheon was served by the ladies of the party in Mr. Naegle's grove at Deer Island at the noon hour.
