Service Suits Foretell
Carefree Vacations

Wistfully and impatiently the city
or town dweller's fancy turns to vi-
sions of vacation days spent in the
country or in the wilderness where
there is no need to be dressed up. The
annual wanderlust finds her consider-
ing the wherewithal she shall be
clothed for camping, hiking, fishing,
mountain climbing or long motor
tours. This question has been set-
tled once for all by those who have
worn the practical and slightly service
suits designed for outdoor pastimes.
A flannel blouse, a pair of khaki
knickerbockers that button below the knees,
a soft felt or fabric hat and a sturdy
reputable of khaki or tweed make up an
outfit that is equal to all sorts of out-
dooring. An example of such a suit
is shown here and it is worn with
woolen stockings and laced sport
shoes that match it in sturdiness.

CONFUCIUS WAS RIGHT

Twenty-five hundred years ago the
Great Chinese philosopher first
stated that rule of living which has
been universally accepted as the
"Golden Rule." Addressing a group
of his Disciples, Confucius said, "Do
not do unto others what thou wouldst
not they do unto thee."

Later, one of his followers, Tzu-
kung, put the rule into slightly dif-
ferent words, "What I do not wish
to have done unto me, I likewise
wish not to do unto others."

But it remained for Christ Jesus
five hundred years afterward, to lift
the statement from its negative into
a definite positive command, "As ye
would that men should do to you, do
ye also to them likewise."

Today we have it still more simply
stated in the modern English, "Do
unto others as you would have them
do unto you."

After twenty-five centuries this
simple standard of living is still the
best, the "golden" rule for all affairs
of life. Now, as never before, it is
becoming recognized as the code of
ethics for the business world, and
great merchants everywhere are
are building great businesses on this
simple foundation.

So when, nowadays, your local
merchants asks you to give him a
fair trial before you purchase your
merchandise outside your own city,
he is merely asking that you "do unto
him" what you should certainly ex-
pect him to "do unto you" if your
positions were reversed. Some day
you, too, may be in a position to
start a business of your own in your
home city. What will you think, then
of those residents who will buy their
merchandise elsewhere, without even
investigating your contention that
you can give them better satisfaction
when quality and service as well as
price are considered? What chance
will there be for your success if
great numbers of your townsmen per-
sist in dis-regarding the golden rule
and trade in some other city, either
by personal visit or through the
house-to-house canvasser?

Your local merchant does not ask
for your business regardless of
whether you can do better elsewhere.
He simply asks that you give him an
equal opportunity to compete with out-
side firms by "shopping around" at
home first.
