off something else.

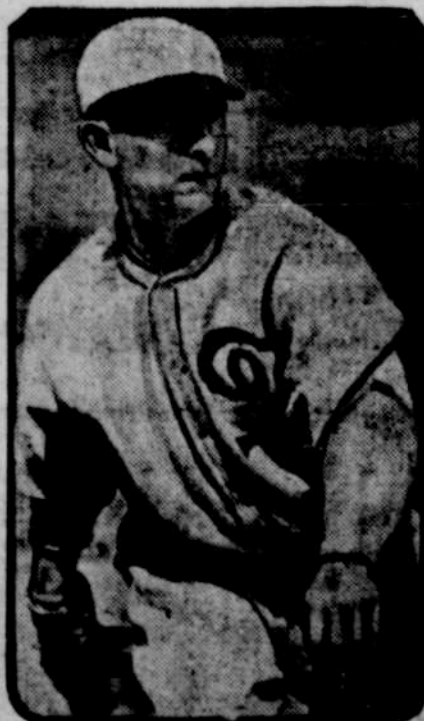
Railroad crossing accidents con-
