FARM POINTERS

Sulfur, chemically combined with calcium to form calcium polysulfide, is the principal active ingredient in lime-sulfur solution. For all practical purposes its concentration is indicated by the hydrometer test which, for commercial brands, should be at least 30 degrees Baume.

The garden slug is a very annoying and destructive garden pest. This repulsive, slimy, slow-moving creature is often incorrectly termed a snail. The adult is about two inches in length. It is a deep mottled gray or greenish-gray in color. The body is covered with a mucous slime which forms a slimy trail on any object over which the slug crawls.

Many methods of destroying ground squirrels have been tried, but probably the most economical and satisfactory in all ways is the use of poison. The biological survey recommends the following: 16 quarts barley, 1 ounce strychnine, 1 ounce baking soda, 1-5 ounce saccharine, 1 pint heavy corn sirup, 3-4 pint thin starch paste, 1 tablespoon glycerine.

Two or more species of caterpillars attack the pear fruit from the time the fruit sets until it is the size of a walnut. Many injured fruits drop, but others mature as scattered and malformed pears, typical examples of fruit-worm injury. These worms appear very early and feed promiscuously over the foliage before the fruit sets. Lead arsenate in the pink spray affords excellent control. The calyx application is not equally successful as it is to rate for best results in control.

That the presence or absence of tuber on scoloration in an unreliable guide to the presence or absence of wilt-producing fungi in potato tubers has been clearly shown on a number of occasions. This is far from being an infallible sign.

"Inside" Information

Apples cooked in a sirup colored with red cinnamon candies are pleasing in appearance and flavor.

Do not add water when roasting beef or lamb. Sear the meat at a high temperature, then reduce the heat and cook 15 or 20 minutes to the pound.

Fried pineapple is easily prepared. Simply drain the slices of canned pineapple, dip in flour, and brown slowly in butter in a frying pan.

Chopped nuts are good in almost any kind of sandwich. Combine them with raisins, dates, figs or prunes. They are good with olives, with cottage or cream cheese, and with maple or brown sugar.

Codliver oil is not a medicine, it is a food, rich in vitamins. There are many children and grown folks, too, who need codliver oil to build up their general health and help prevent other infections.

Ham for baking may be boiled a day or two before hand, left standing in a cold place in the liquor in which it was cooked, reheated in this, then skinned, covered with bread crumbs and sugar stuck with cloves and put in the oven for final browning just before dinner.

To prevent jelly from oozing out of the glass and spoiling the paraffin seal, run a knife around the edge of the jelly before pouring on the paraffin, or rotate the glass after the hot paraffin is poured on and let it run up the sides of the glass and form a tight seal.

The red color sometimes admired in devil's food cake is due to the use of more soda than is necessary to neutralize the acid in the sour milk and chocolate. This results in taking into the body more soda, or free alkali than is desirable, as one does when serving hot biscuits made yellow with excess of soda. Too red a devil's food cake, therefore is not good.

Radioed From USDA

In the summer, it usually takes 52 degrees to 60 degrees Fahrenheit in the churn to have the little grains of butter firm. In winter, it usually takes from 58 to 66 degrees. In the spring, after the cows have been turned out to pasture, if you use the same temperature you do in winter, the butter will probably come in much shorter time and will be quite soft. In that case, all you have to do is use a lower temperature at the next churning.

To get rid of lice give the hen three pinches of sodium fluoride, one on the head and neck, one on the back, and one below the vent. For small chicks you can use two very small pinches to each chick. Distribute one of the pinches on the neck, and top of the head, and throat, and the other on the back and below the vent. Give the treatment while the chicks are active and don't let them hover for some time, so that the free powder will be shaken off. Never use sodium fluoride on chicks before they are 1 week old.

Red cedar, locust, white oak, catalpa, mulberry, and chestnut, all make good durable posts. But you can make them last longer by treating them with cresote before you set them. Cresote and helal posts are good, too. But where timber is plentiful, wood posts are usually cheaper.

Soybeans and sudan grass are excellent crops for growing in mixture. Not only a better yield, but a better balanced forage is obtained, as the sudan grass is low and the soybean high in protein. The mixed hay is easily harvested and cured. It is cut for hay about the time the soybean seeds are half grown. The best results are obtained by broadcasting, using about 50 pounds of seed, either the Wilson or Virginia variety of soybeans, and 10 pounds of sudan grass to the acre.

Drying Off Cows

In drying off cows which are persistent milk producers it is often necessary to cut down the allowance of feed, especially grain. Any cow may be dried off more quickly by reducing her feed. Most cows can be dried off by lessening gradually the frequent of milking. First miss one milking, next miss two, then three, etc. When the daily production is only 6 or 8 pounds milking may be stopped entirely. After that nothing should be done to stimulate milk secretion. If signs of inflammation appear after several days draw out the milk that has accumulated.

Cistern For Drinking Water

The vital features of a cistern for drinking water are: (1) Absolute watertightness of top, sides,

and bottom, and close screening of inlet and waste pipes; (2) provisions for excluding from the cistern the first portion of each rainfall until the roof or other collecting area has become rinsed thoroughly; (3) a firstclass filter of clean well-selected sand and thoroughly burned charcoal; (4) a waste pipe which removes surplus inflow from the bottom of the cistern where impurities tend naturally to settle; (5) periodic and thorough cleaning of the cistern and filter; (6) no connection between the waste pipe and a sewer or a drain which may carry impure drainage.

Whitewashing Hints

Cow stables are usually whitewashed once or twice a year. Whitewash may be applied with a brush or with a spray pump. It can be applied more heavily with a brush, one coat sometimes giving as good results as two with the sprayer. Spraying, of course, is quicker, but smears up the floor and equipment more than the brush method. Regardless of what method is used, time will be saved in cleaning if the equipment is covered with old bags or similar material. If the floor is kept wet while the whitewashing is in progress, the whitewash that is dropped will not stick so tightly but that it can be dislodged readily with water and a brush or broom. Whitewash will adhere much better to a rough surface than to a smooth one.

Low or medium producing cows should be dry a month or six weeks. High producers need a longer dry period.

Eggs from hens that have been forced for eggs as a rule don't hatch so well as eggs from hens that haven't been forced.

Because of the large number of skippers which may be produced by a single piece of meat, it is advisable to destroy promptly all infested meat which can not be reconditioned by trimming.

To prevent silage flavor in milk, feed the silage immediately after milking. Some farmers feed it during or before milking and as a result find their milk flavored with the feed. Although milk will absorb some silage taint from the air the greatest amount comes through the body of the cow.

The use of certified seed potatoes insures the grower against planting seed stock containing a high percentage of diseased or weak plants, and with proper cultural attention and satisfactory soil and climatic conditions assures him a maximum yield of good quality stock. In 11,627 tests conducted in many localities in the United States and Canada the average gain from certified seed potatoes was 46.4 bushels per acre.
