Farm Reminders
Sprays on perennial weeds in Oregon are being tried out more extensively than ever this year. There have been a few cases of fairly deep kills but for the most part the various treatments have proved quite expensive, experiment station men have found.

Hungarian vetch is the best of the vetches for forage in Oregon where the soil is cold and wet, or where there is danger of freezing injury, the experiment station advises. It is usually sowed at 60 to 80 pounds an acre with about 40 pounds of winter oats.
