Vaccinate Against Smallpox

At a special meeting of the school board in the evening of December 8, 1927, for the purpose of laying plans to meet the present outbreak of smallpox in the grade schools of Vernonia, Oregon, it was voted after due consideration to the Oregon law, which follows:

144. Persons Afflicted With Contagious Diseases.

Any board of directors may, on account of the prevalence of any contagious disease or to prevent the spread of such contagious disease, prohibit the attendance of any teacher or scholar upon any school under their control, and may specify the time during which such teacher or scholar shall remain away from such school, and may prohibit the attendance of any unvaccinated child, who has not had the smallpox, upon the schools under their control, and shall also have power to decide how far re-vaccination shall be required if a case or cases of smallpox have occurred in the city or district. (O. L. 5045.)

To advise all parents to have their children who have not been vaccinated within the last seven years, and who have not had smallpox, to be vaccinated and thereby attend school as usual.

Jailed for Disorderly Conduct.

Frank Austrom plead guilty guilty in Judge Reasoner's court Monday morning to two counts, disorderly conduct and being intoxicated in a public cafe. He was fined \$25 and \$40 respectively. Being unable to pay the fine, he was put in jail for a period of 33 days.

Marshal Kelly has issued a warning that any sort of disorderly conduct in Vernonia restaurants or cafes will be dealt with severely, as numerous complaints have arisen from local restaurant folk of improper conduct on the part of some that have offended other guests in their establishments.

Several parties have been given in honor of Mrs. C. Nicar, who with Mr. Nicar has left for a six weeks visit in Texas.

Sustained demand for the Pontiac Six during the season when automobile sales normally are expected to decrease, and anticipation of still greater public acceptance in 1928, have prompted the company again to expand its production capacity, Mr. Giancy explained.

Together the three assembly lines will be able to produce 120 Pontiac Sixes per hour or one complete car every 30 seconds. The Pontiac Six factory thus will have a production capacity of 1080 cars per nine hour day. This, together with the 720-car daily capacity of the two new Oakland All-American Six assembly lines in the Oakland factory, will give a total capacity of 1800 automobiles during each nine hour day, or one unit every 18 seconds.

The car assembly plant, where the third Pontiac Six assembly line is being installed, is one of the \$12,000,000 group of buildings, finished early in 1927 which provided the Pontiac Six with a separate factory. In anticipation of the eventual need for higher production, space for a third car assembly line was left between the two present assembly lines. This foresight is reducing greatly the cost of the third line installation.

The \$12,000,000 Pontiac Six factory group was built simultaneously with the expenditure of \$3,000,000 for increasing and improving the manufacturing facilities of the Oakland Six factories.

you can go to war as a Red Cross nurse and I am sure you would look much more womanly and beautifully hat over her touseled head and weary brain, "What was Christ born for, girls?" Silence was the only answer; nobody seemed to know.

Our present day history, in defying the position of the first American woman, relates that she not only cooked, sewed and built the wigwam, but used the scanty crops of corn, beans and melons, and in journeying from one hunting ground to another, she carried the wigwam, poles and furs, and is called the drudg.

But with all, she had an influence over her husband and children.

Then we drift along for around four centuries when we discover in 1920, and in this same book, this time with much pride, that women can do the work of men. Considering that the original idea of women's entrance into politics was to purify it with her womanly presence, her womanly instincts and qualities, it would lead one to think that somebody had lost the step. No law ever gave a woman the outlook of a man. No law can ever make a man a man if his mother has failed to make him one.

I expect by the time we are in politics a few hundred years, we will realize more and more, that this old world carries a copyright on a few little ways of its own.

However, that women should feel the call to progress, I do not wonder. Progress is the very incentive of life itself.

I sometimes find myself comparing the unrest of women and the struggles of the human family, to the tides of the ocean. To the whispering, splashing, struggling waters, which with all their efforts only rear a certain point, when the ebb tide returns them to deep waters again.

And of such has been the story of life in the ages gone by, and of such will be the story in the ages to come.

With the human family forever listening, and reaching out, and

struggling, expecting with each tide to grasp the will-o'-the-wisp of life, something incessantly whispers to us and beckons us on to progress, Please Turn to Page 5




