## Home Reminders

If ivory has become yellowed than desired place in the sun to bleach.

Soaking game in salt water over night takes out the strong flavor. Abnormal size vegetables usually means hard, woody fiber and poor flavor.

Mildew in the clothes hamper will be killed if flour of sulphur is sprinkled about inside and on the clothes. Mildew is a fungus growing in the fabric's texture.

To clean satins of delicate colors (or white) rub with dry bread crumbs or dip in a weak solution of borax.

Curtains will hang more evenly if the selvage is cut from the goods before hemming. This applies to heavy and thin goods alike.

The steel on even doors is easily cleaned if rubbed briskly with a soft cloth dipped in vinegar while the steel is warm.

A little lemon added to water in which rice is boiled will whiten it wonderfully. This will also help to keep the grains separated.

If stuffed green peppers are oiled before baking they will not turn brown in the oven.

## Farm Reminders

When eggs are on the downward trend the poultryman needs a full egg basket to pay the feed bill. The experiment station advises the use of lights where possible and the feeding of wet mash in Oregon to guard against a drop until spring conditions assure right production.

Spring harrowing of fall sown grain is not recommended as a result of many trials at the Oregon experiment station. The harrowing very often reduces the yield by tearing out many plants.

Good barley seed is hard to obtain unless ordered early. Because of high feeding value the best varieties of barley are sometimes

Flax wilt is guarded against by treating the seed with formaldehyde before planting. This disease was noted in Oregon last summer on seed which had not been treated. Further soil infection is also prevented by this treatment.
