**Kitchen Recitals**

**Canned Peas (Upon Request)**

Shell the peas as soon as taken from the vines, wash and pack in jars, shaking down meanwhile. Set the cans over lukewarm water on the cloth-covered rack or on bits of wood in the canner; heat until the water boils. Fill each jar to overflow with boiling water and cook until the peas are nearly tender; adjust the rubbers, add boiling water to fill the jars and return the lids. Cook 10 minutes, tighten the lids and set away to cool.

**Chocolate Sauce for Vanilla Ice Cream**

1 square unweetened chocolate  
1 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons Karo syrup  
1 tablespoon butter  
1/2 cup boiling water  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla

A few grains of salt  
Melt chocolate, add butter, and pour water on gradually. Bring to boiling point, add sugar, and Karo, and let boil five minutes; cool slightly, and add vanilla and salt.

**Ice Cream**

1—Vanilla Ice Cream.  
1 quart thin cream  
3/4 cup sugar  
1 1/2 tablespoons vanilla  
Mix ingredients and freeze. A few grains of salt improves ice cream.

2—Vanilla Ice Cream.  
2 cups scalded milk  
1 tablespoon flour  
1 cup sugar  
1 egg  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 quart thin cream  
2 tablespoons vanilla

Mix flour, sugar, salt, add egg slightly beaten, and milk gradually; cook over hot water 10 minutes stirring constantly at first. Should the custard


