RESOLUTION Whereas, the council of the city of Vernonia, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve the streets of the city of Vernonia, hereinafter described in the manner set forth, and has required from the city engineer, plans and specifications and the probable costs for an

appropriate improvement, and Whereas, the said city engineer has heretofore filed said plans, specifications, estimates and probable costs in the office of the city recorder, now therefore,

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Vernonia, Oregon, that the aforesaid plans, specifications and estimates of the city engineer, now on file with the city recorder are found to be satisfactory and are hereby approved, and

Be it further resolved that the council does declare its intention of making said improvement, the location and kind of said improvement is as follows: Construct wooden sidewalks four feet in width with three stringers, in and upon the following streets, to-wit:

East and west side of First avenue from Clatsop street to Bridge street east side of Second avenue from Cedar street to Bridge street east side of Third avenue from Nehalem street to Bridge street west side of Grant street from A street to Bridge street, north and south side of North street from Grant street to the end thereof, north and south side of A street from State street to the end thereof, north and south side of B street from State street to the end thereof, east and west side of State street from C. street to Bridge street, north side of

Bridge street from State street to the end thereof.

The engineer's estimate of the probable cost of said improvement as shown by the files of the recorder is \$1265.

The district liable to be assessed and the property benefited thereby shall be known as Improvement district No. 12 and is described as follows:

Lot 8, block 5, central addition to the city of Vernonia; Lot 12, block 6, central addition to the city of Vernonia; Lots 11 and 12, block 4 central addition to the city of Vernonia; lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12, block 7, central addition to the city of Vernonia; lots 4 and 5, block 4, central addition to the city of Vernonia; lots 8 and 12, block 2, sunrise addition to the city of Vernonia; lots 12 and 13, block 2, central addition to the city of Vernonia; lot 8, block 16, east side addition to the city of Vernonia; lots 1 and 10, block 14, east side addition to the city of Vernonia; lots 1 and 10, block 11, east side addition to the city of Vernonia; lots 6 and 10, block 5, east side addition to the city of Vernonia; lot 6, block 6, east side addition to the city of Vernonia; lot 20, Broadway addition to the city of Vernonia; lot 2, block 1, west's addition to the city of Vernonia; lots 9 and 10, block 11, west's addition to the city of Vernonia and lots 1 and 2, block 3 west's addition to the city of Vernonia.

Be it further resolved that objections and remonstrances may be filed with the city recorder against the proposed improvement at any time within twenty (20) days after the first publication of this resolution, and the same will be heard and considered by the council at its first regular meeting subsequent to the expiration of said twenty (20) days.

Be it further resolved that the city recorder do give notice of the passage of this resolution by causing the same to be published in two consecutive issues of the Eagle, a newspaper published in Columbia county, Oregon.

Whereas, it is necessary that the aforesaid improvement be made at as early date as possible on account of the necessity for the completion thereof before the bad weather commences and it is necessary for the immediate peace, health and safety of the city of Vernonia that said improvement be made in the immediate future.

Now therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the mayor.

Passed by the council this 20th day of August, 1929, by the following vote: YEAS: McGraw, Hanson, Mellinger.
