OREGON STATE COLLEGE, CORVALLIS, MAY 27—Gilbert Bergerson the tall blond giant from Vernonia displayed some of his rugged strength in the dual meet with the University of Oregon here Saturday.

Bergerson upset the dope when he defeated Dickson of Oregon in the shot put. He heaved the lead 45 feet 9 1/4 inches. He is a sophomore, this being his first year of varsity competition. Coach Dick Newman predicts a bright future for him in this event. He participated in the last meet of the year at Pullman, Saturday.

Bergerson is not only starring on the track team but is one of the best tackles on the varsity football squad. Coach P. J. Schissler is grooming him for this position on the team next year and also as defensive center. He will probably alternate with Buck Hammer at this position.
