Ginseng is a fleshy-rooted herbaceous plant native to the eastern United States. It was formerly of frequent occurrence in shady, welldrained situations in hardwood forests of central New York. In Orlental countries, especially in China ginseng root is considered a panaces or a so-called "Gift of the Gods," supposed to cure anything from a stomach ache to tuberculosis. The western world does not recognize any special medicinal properties in ginseng. The plant has little do-mestic value and its standing as a commodity depends upon the distant foreign market in China.

#### Cork Oaks Long Producers

Cork is the outer bark of the cork aak, of which there are vast forests in Portugal, Spain and North Africa. A tree must be about twenty years old before it gives its first so-called virgin cork. Virgin cork is of little commercial value. The next harvest is not ready for stripping for nearly a decade, but this stripping, too, is of little commercial value. The product from each subsequent stripping of the tree, however, improves in quality. When a tree reaches the age of forty years, its bark may be called high-grade cork. Oork oaks produce for more than a century.

#### Became Cruel King


