Opening and closing dates for hunting this year were announced recently by the Oregon State Game commission as follows:

BEAR - Open season entire year except in Jackson, Josephine and Klamath counties where open season is from November 1 to November 30.

BUCK DEER, with forked horns -Open season September 20 to October 25, both dates inclusive. Bag limit, 2 Columbia blacktail deer or 1 mule deer, with the requirement that both deer tags must be affixed to the mule deer.

BULL ELK, having horns Open season November 5 to November 11, both dates inclusive.
