Fisher talked about books in relation to this year's slogan, "Ride the Book Trail to Knowledge and Adventure."
for the interest being displayed in book week, Mrs. E. S. Thompson, chairman of the library board, stated that she wanted to especially interest people living outside the city limits in helping the library. People living in town pay a small tax to help support the library, she said, while those living outside receive all privileges of using the library free of cost, and yet pay no tax for its upkeep. Although many libraries charge people living out of town a small fee for the use of their books, it is not the local library's intention of resorting to this practice during this time of financial stress. "Everyone living within Vernonia's trading area is welcome to use the library freely," Mrs. Thompson said, "but it is hoped that many of them will express their appreciation by giving something to help the library get more books to serve them better."

C. R. Pritchard, minister of the Christian church, who reads books widely, has written the following article on the theme for this year's book week, and offers a number of concrete suggestions for profitable reading.

In this nervous, hectic world it is good for us to sit down alone with a book and be quiet. To the inexperienced person this may seem to be a very dry procedure; but it is not. There is many a field of knowledge open to us through the book door. Great anniversaries open their doors to us, far away people tell us of their findings in the many fields of human endeavor. May I suggest for illustration the study of archeology, the study of how men uncover the ruins of past generations to see how men lived and what they thought and did. This is very interesting as it is constantly bringing to light new proof of the truth of the Bible, particularly the Old Testament history.

Another book door opens into the world of fine entertainment. I was just reading today from the Prophet Jeremiah. He speaks of the people who turned away from God as having left the clear spring water and built for themselves, poor, broken cisterns at that. People do the same when they go out to seek entertainment; they will leave a fine story to go out to soak themselves in a "bucket of suds". In this regard may I suggest the books of Joseph C. Lincoln as being replete with good humor and very entertaining. I am thinking particularly of "Rugged Waters" and "Captain Warren's Wards".

Another interesting book door opens to the road to adventure. If you have longed to travel and cannot, try the book method. The National Geographic Magazine is splendid as most everyone knows. Particularly I would suggest the twenty or more books in the Vagabond Series. They are stories of real men who really traveled and as far as I know the series, they are entirely authentic. There is another book that I recently read that to me is an adventure in living the Christlike life in this day and age. "Kagawa" by Wm. Axling is the story of a present day Japanese Christian who, I venture to say, lives more in a day than most of us live in a year or more. If you want a real thrill, read this book. There is another book that I would not have any forget to open. That is the door that leads to a knowledge of God and how he would have men and nations live. This door is open through the Bible, which is the word of God, and there is no other way that we can gain this knowledge. We must not neglect it. May I suggest that there be placed in the library several good Bibles that those who have none in their homes may have access to this Word of Life.
