**SCHOOL BOUNDARY CHANGE MADE BY COUNTY BOARD**

the ground that when the area was timbered Vernonia had the benefit of the tax income from it and now wishes to get rid of it when the land is logged off and families with children are settling on it. Vernonia's contention was that access to Vernonia is impossible from that section, which is immediately adjacent to Chapman, and that children should be taken care of in schools convenient to them and at the least expense to taxpayers. Upon objection from Chapman that children of families that might settle to the west of the ridge could not reach the Chapman school without great trouble and expense a proposal to compromise was made by Vernonia, and this was accepted by the boundary board by assigning to Chapman only those sections east of the ridge. It was brought out that during part of the last school year two pupils from the area now belonging to Chapman were boarded in Vernonia at an expense of \$35 a month to the taxpayers. There are no children at present in the area west of the ridge.

Representing Vernonia were I. N. McCollom, principal, A. F. Baker of the Clark and Wilson Lumber Co., and Ray D. Fisher, chairman of the board of directors. Members of the boundary board are Judge J. B. Wilkerson, Commissioners Wm. Pringle, Sr., and Tilden Graham, and County Superintendent E. H. Condit, secretary.
