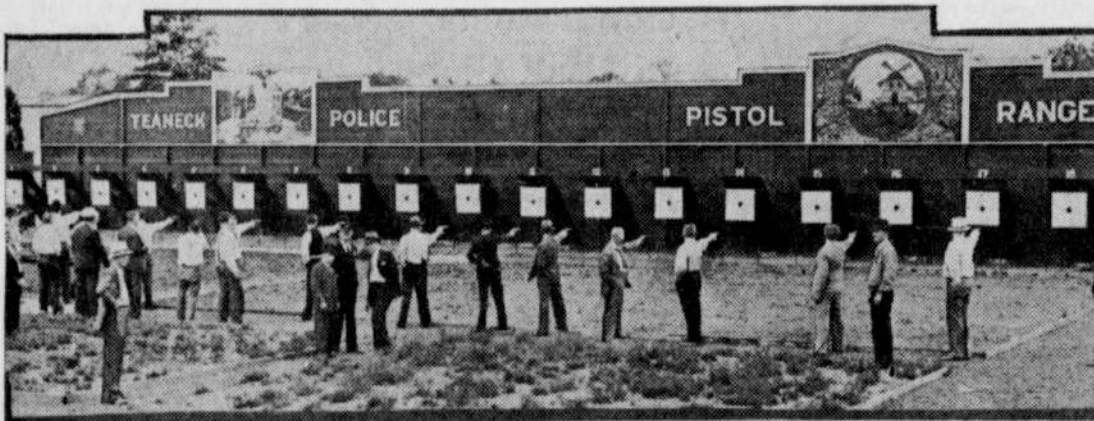


Scenes and Persons in the Current News
