Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the undersigned until the hour of 8 o'clock p. m. on the 21st day of March, 1936, and immediately thereafter publicly opened by the district school board of Union High School district No. 1, of Columbia county, Oregon, at the High School building at Vernonia, Oregon, for an issue of funding bonds of said school district in the amount of \$45,600.00, to be sold for not less than par value and accrued interest, to be dated March 21, 1936, and to mature serially in numerical order at the rate of \$4560.00 on the 21st day of March in each of the years 1937 to 1946, inclusive, provided, however, that bonds of said issue which mature on or after March 21, 1938, are subject to call and redemption on March 21, 1938, and on interest paying date thereafter.

Said bonds are to bear interest at a rate to be specified by the bidder not to exceed 6 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, both principal and interest payable at the fiscal agency of the state of Oregon in the city and state of New York or at the office of the county treasurer of Columbia county, Oregon.
