Jackson told state police the night before that there might be some trouble on the picket line, and said it might be another false alarm, and that he had plenty of men in camp to take care of that end.

I notice you failed to indict ten men who had been questioned by the District Attorney, and who admitted (some of them) in my presence of being in the camp during the riot. Just why? You are under oath.

This report reads like it was written by the political pen of one Tom Jackson, manager of the Crown camp, who has asked

two different men to be candidates for sheriff. This Grand Jury is not whiter than snow, and it might be well for some of them to dust out their own back yards. I have been sheriff for almost twelve years, and have never been accused of or been caught trying to get away with stolen goods. Sheriffs are elected by choice, while Grand Juries are selected by accident—accidents will happen!

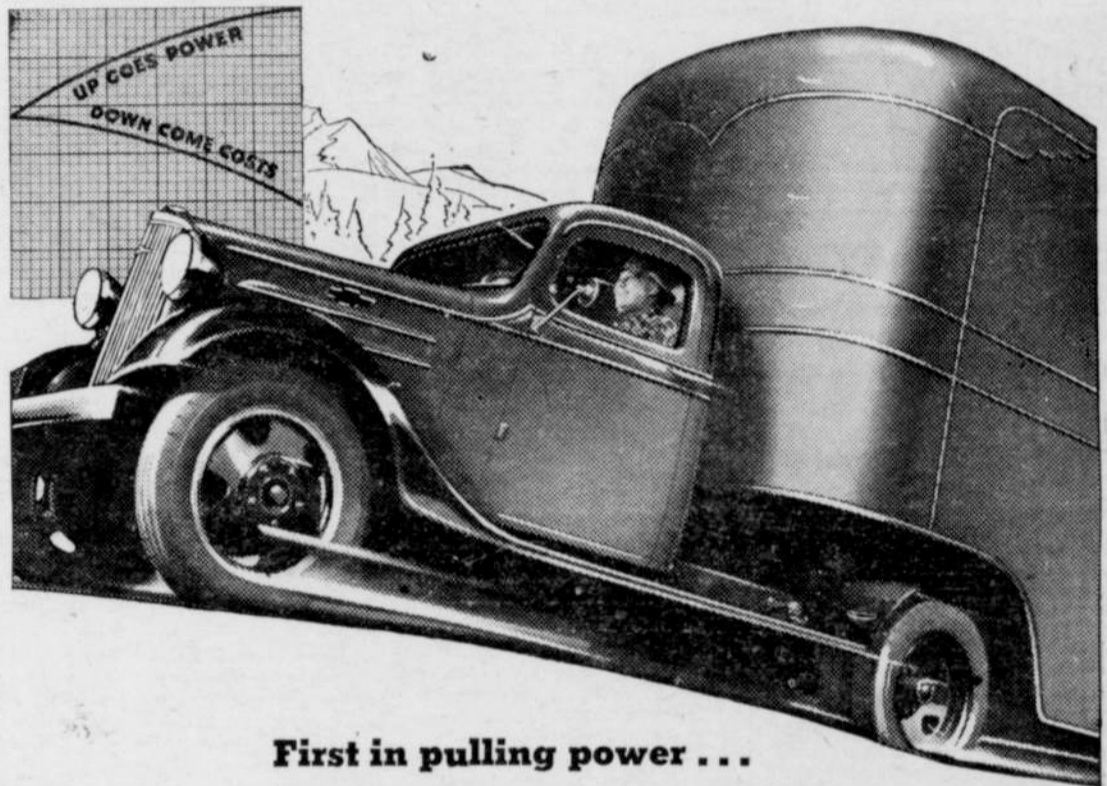

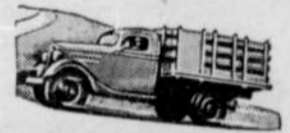
