

**1937 FORD V-8**

The bodies of the new Ford V-8's are roomy and exceptionally comfortable for driver and passenger. Removal of the hand-brake lever from the floor position to more convenient place under the cowl on a level with the driver's left hand, together with unusually wide front seats, adds appreciably to front compartment comfort.

A new type of seat is used in all tudor sedans and the five-window coupe, roadster and cabriolet models. The seat cushion is in one piece with a two-sectioned back that tilts forward, giving considerably more seat room than in previous models of this type.

Increased riding comfort has resulted from improved "Center-poise Ride" introduced by Ford two years ago. The taper of the spring leaves has been increased in length to give even smoother spring action.

The new V-type windshield not only increases visibility materially, but gives added ventilation when necessary. In all closed cars it may be opened by a control mechanism situated on the instrument panel. The Ford built-in clear vision ventilation system is continued in the new cars. Safety glass is provided at no extra cost in windshields and windows of all cars in the 1937 line.

Highlight of 1937 mechanical improvements, the new braking system introduces easy-action, self-energizing, safety brakes which give quicker stopping with softer pedal pressure. Utilizing the cable and conduit principle, these new brakes provide "The safety of steel from pedal to wheel." Engineers describe this type of brake as "self energizing," because the movement of the car aids materially in applying them.

The driver will find the 1937 Ford V-8's easier to steer and, at the same time, easier to park because of changes in the steering mechanism.

These improvements are due to an increase in the ratio of the steering gear and a new

roller type of steering gear sector, which has led to a material reduction in friction. Together they provide virtual "finger tip" control of the car.

The motorist has eleven different body types to choose from in the new line. Those with deluxe equipment are the tudor sedan, tudor touring sedan, fordor sedan, fordor touring sedan, 5-window coupe, club coupe, cabriolet, club cabriolet, convertible sedan, roadster and phaeton. All of these body styles are available with the 85-horsepower engine.
