## COYOTE PELTS BROUGHT TO ST. HELENS

Four coyote pelts were brouht into St. Helens by Chester Hight, government trapper from the U. S. biological survey office, who has been working in Columbia county for a short time on the trapping and poisoning of coyotes which have been destroying by Nehalem Chapter, O. E.

Some \$250 losses were reported by A. A. Schwab of Deer Island from loss of turkeys and sheep killed by coyotes, and also heavy losses of turkeys were experienced by Loren Johnson at Scappoose.
