MORE CONSTRUCTION At the meeting held in the ON WOLF CREEK ORDERED (Hillsboro Argus)

Construction of 4.3 miles of additional highway on the Wolf creek sea road, has been authorized by WPA, according to K. E. Tillotson, resident engineer. The new project is all in Clatson county, entailing a total cost of \$646,734 of which only \$10,512 will be paid by the sponsors for machinery and other incidental costs which the government will not carry.

Of the total mileage, two miles mainder is through virgin forest and will present considerable of a problem to the crews.
