Mrs. Floyd Rose, nee Doris Lindgren, of Taylorville, is visiting here this week.

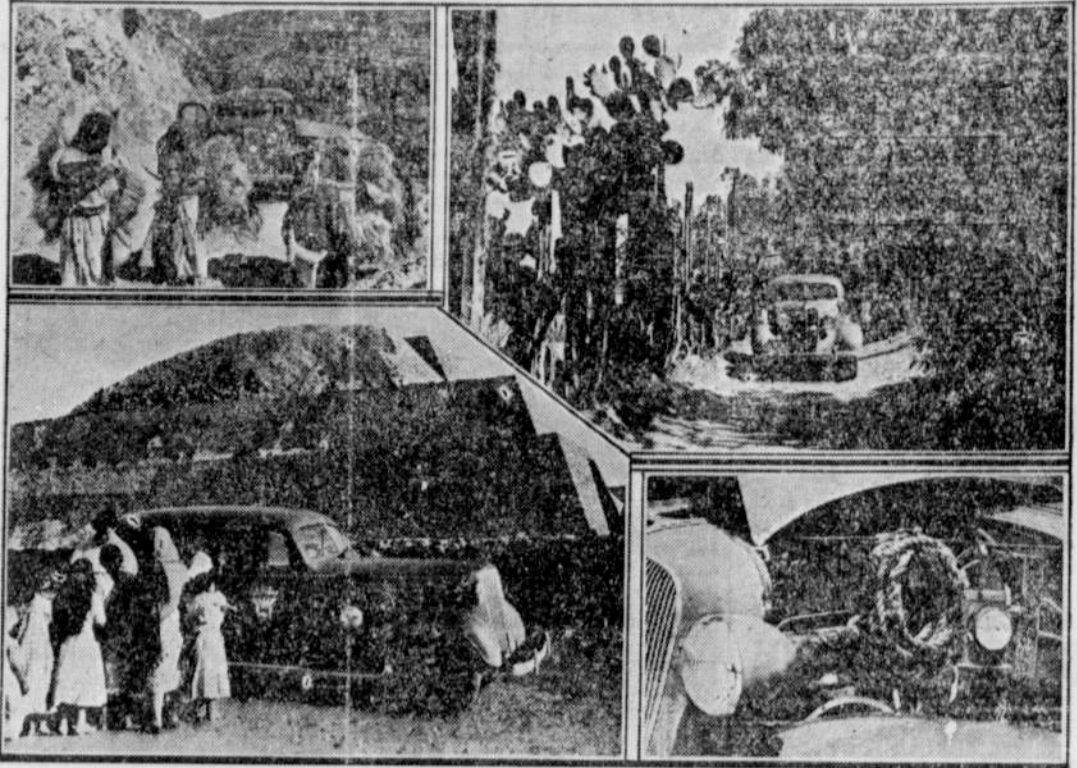
Mr. and Mrs. C. S. Hoffman have purchased a Studebaker through E. S. Thompson.

## Chevrolet Road Scout in Mexico



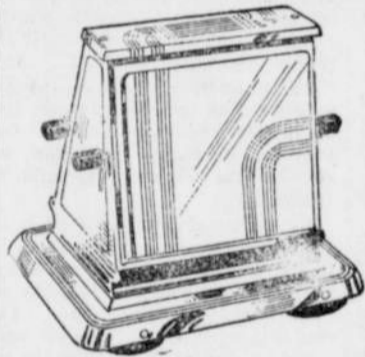

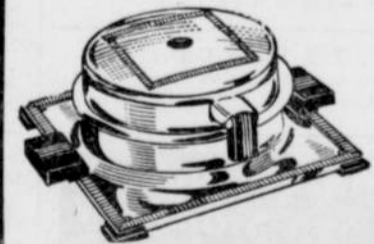
