Mrs. Bob Morrell was elected school teacher for the Pleasant Vale school for the coming year.

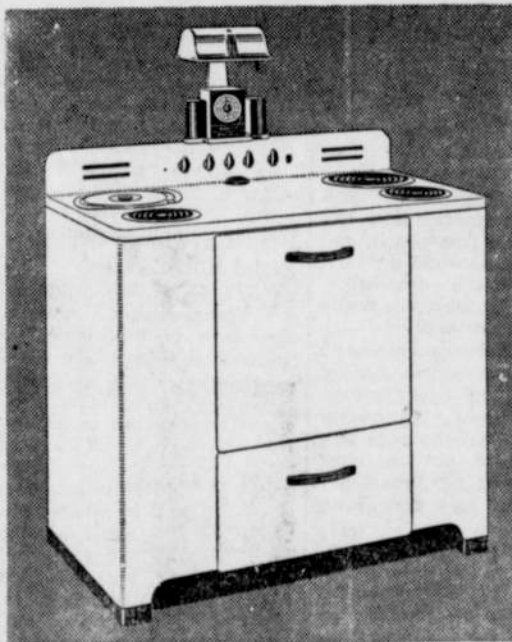

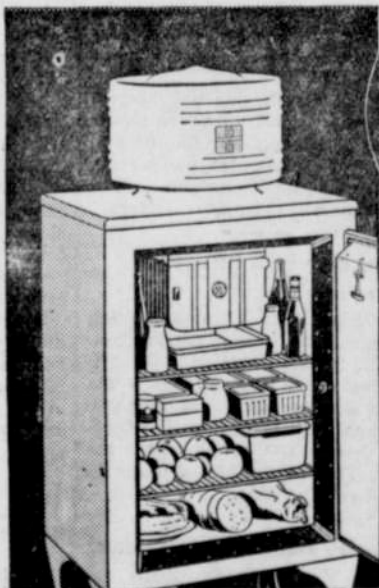
