Mr. and Mrs. Cecil Angelsey spent a week visiting relatives at Mill City and Dallas, Oregon.

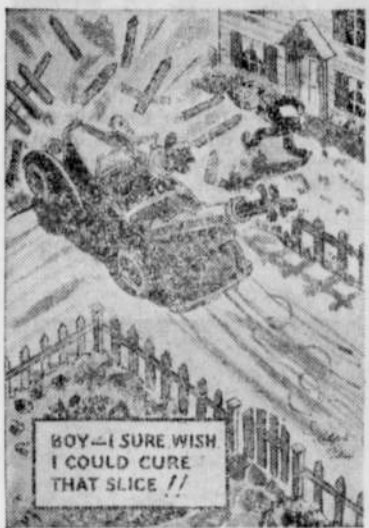
Charles Malmsten left Saturday to visit with relatives in Gresham for a few days.

Clatsop has improved all 212 miles of its road, using this year a road fund of \$177,960, while Columbia has to use most of its money to grade and keep up its 700 miles of untopped roads, having a total fund of \$63,187. After machinery and bridge costs are subtracted, only \$36,000 is left for road work, the judge said.

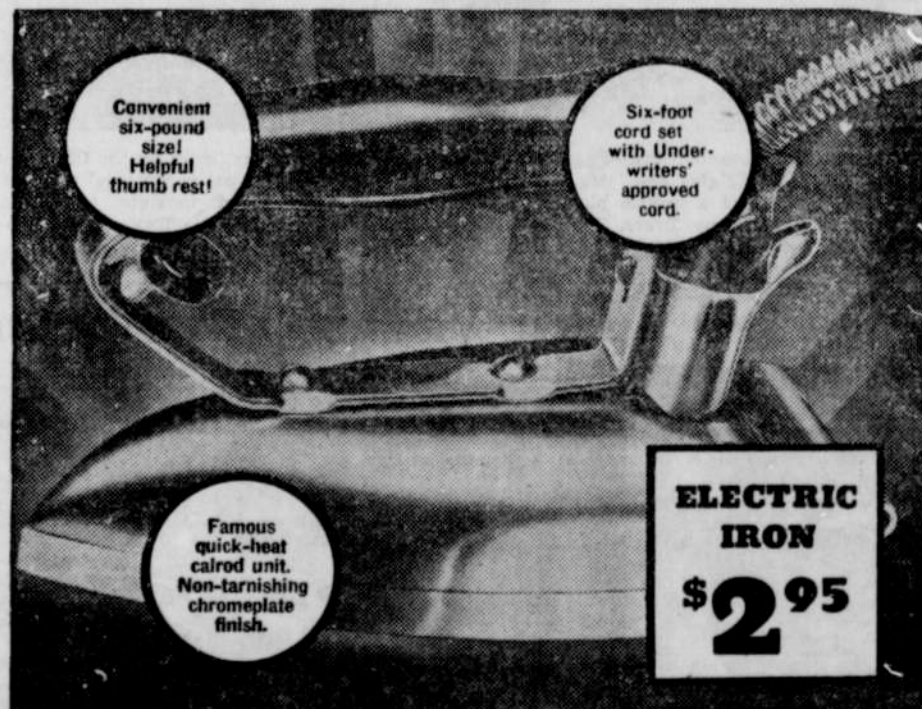
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
