### **Magoff Elected** As President of Softball League

Bill Washburn to Be Vice-President; J. Turkington, Secretary and E. Michener, Scorekeeper

Joe Magoff was chosen to organize and lead the Vernonia Softball league for next year. As president of the league he plans to call a meeting May 1, 1938 of all persons or firms who want to sponsor a club or team.

Elected as vice-president was William Washburn. In case of Magoff's absence next year Washburn will become president until the league is under way.

Junior Turkington will continue to function as secretarytreasurer, and Elmer Michener as score keeper.
