SHERMAN NICAR IS HURT WHILE PLAYING FOOTBALL

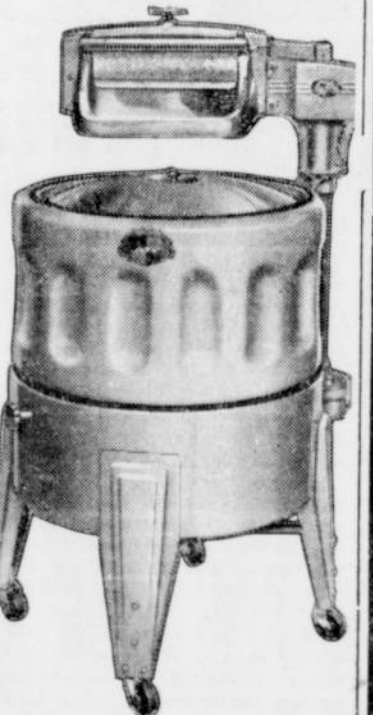
Sherman Nicar, a high school student, broke his collar bone Wednesday while playing in a practice game between the high school second team and some grade school pupils.
