Mrs. Judd Greenman, chairman of the Study Club's division of the Red Cross drive, assigned residential sections for members to solicit.

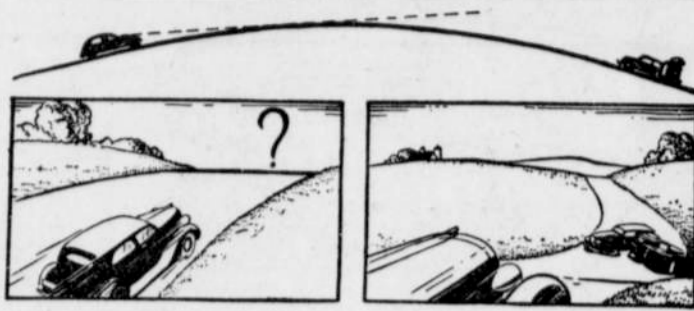
