IS IT LEGAL TO RIDE BICYCLES TWO OR MORE ABREAST ON THE HIGHWAY?

This is one of those frequent cases in which common sense plays as large a part as does a strict interpretation of the law. The state law says that bicyclists are subject to the same traffic regulations as are motor vehicle operators; and these traffic regulations that drivers must remain as near to the right edge of the highway as practicable except when passing another car or when passing around some obstruction in the road. Bicyclists should follow the same rule, and riding two abreast is a violation of the rule.

Common sense also dictates that bicyclists ride single file. Confusion and accident are very apt to result if bicyclists are riding hit-or-miss all over the right half of the highway, particularly in large groups; but if the bicyclists proceed in orderly fashion, single file, motorists will have no difficulty in passing them, no matter how many of them there are.

Some local bicycle ordinances prohibit riding two or more abreast on the streets and highways.

IS IT LAWFUL TO DRIVE WITH A DEFECTIVE WINDSHIELD WHICH IMPAIRS VISION?

Absolutely not. In order to insure that drivers shall have a clear view ahead at all times, the law very definitely states that no person shall drive a vehicle with a sign, poster, or other nontransparent material obscuring the windshield. Dirt on the windshield certainly classifies as a nontransparent material, and as a matter of fact has been the cause of many accidents reported to the secretary of state. Safety glass which has checked and cracked so as to be nontransparent is also illegal.

Incidentally, the same rule about obstruction to view applies to side windows and side and rear windows, as well as to the windshield.

Potato Show By Growers Is Held March 18

Warren Man Takes Honors in Display; Flea Beetle Research Explained

A meeting and potato show of the Columbia county Potato Growers Association was held on Friday, March 18, at St. Helens.

At this meeting general problems of interest to the growers were discussed in regard to the grading of potatoes so as to obtain the best prices. The matter of flea beetle control was gone into quite thoroughly by Kenneth Gray of the Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station, whose headquarters for the flea beetle investigations are in St. Helens.

Gray also reported on control measures and reported that rotenone seems to give the best results in controlling this insect.

Jarvis Davis, president of the Agricultural Conservation Association, gave a report of the potato control requirements under the Agricultural Conservation program in which he stated that all potato growers who had three acres or more were subject to the control program.

In the potato show Verner Josephson of Warren won first place, John Josephson, Warren, second place, and G. R. Anliker, Goble, third place.
