TO ALL OPERATORS (logging, mills and woodcutting): If you are covered by a Forest Operator's Permit, you may now operate between the hours of 12 midnight and 1 p. m. This allowance is pursuant to relative humidity which cannot be below 35 degrees.

If there is existing a strong east wind, the operator must cease operations. Each operator must have means and ways of testing the humidity hourly and keep a record of same as it is necessary that the field inspector check all re-
