West Point, Annapolis to Take Youths

Congressman Says Two from Oregon May Get Places; Exam Date Set

Congressman James W. Mott has announced that the First Congressional District of Oregon will have a vacancy in 1939 at both the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis and at the U. S. Military Academy at West Point.

To determine the eligible candidates residing in his District, Congressman Mott has requested the Civil Service Commission to hold a preliminary qualifying examination on Saturday, October 8, 1938.

Any young unmarried man, not less than sixteen years of age nor more than twenty years of age on April 1, 1939 may take the qual-

ifying examination for the Annapolis appointment.

Candidates for the West Point appointment must be not under 17 nor over 22 years of age on July 1, 1939, and not less than 5 feet 4 inches in height.

In order to make the required arrangements it is necessary that the applicant notify Congressman James W. Mott, 328 Oregon Building, Salem, Oregon, not later than September 1, 1938 of his desire to participate in the examination.

STATE FORESTER ISSUES IMPORTANT FIRE STATEMENT

TO ALL OPERATORS (logging, mills and woodcutting):

If you are covered by a Forest Operator's Permit, you may now operate between the hours of 12 midnight and 1 p. m. This allowance is pursuant to relative humidity which cannot be below 35 degrees.

If there is existing a strong east wind, the operator must cease operations. Each operator must have means and ways of testing the humidity hourly and keep a record of same as it is necessary that the field inspector check all records.

Psychometers are available through the state forester's office and must be in service at each operation within three days following lifting of closure.

Youths to Get Awards At Fair

4-H and Future Farmers to Get Nearly \$5,000 in Prizes

Oregon's farm youth will have a splendid opportunity to show their wares and enter clean competition for prizes and scholarships valued at over \$7,000 at the 1938 Oregon State Fair at Salem, September 5 to 11, Manager Leo G. Spitzbart pointed out this week.

"We are growing increasingly youth-conscious at the fair," Mr. Spitzbart says. "This year's large array of prizes is given to encourage farm-minded young men and women to take advantage of the progressive agricultural practices. A well trained youth turns into the best kind of farmer, we believe." Awards given entirely to boys

and girls are those in the 4-H club and the Future Farmers of America contests. In these two departments, the Oregon State Fair will offer nearly \$5,000 in cash prizes this year. In addition, 4-H clubbers are offered 148 full and half-time scholarships, valued at about \$1,500, to attend the annual summer school at the state college. The list of prizes is also boosted by numerous specials which will be given. Interested firms and individuals will present winners with purebred livestock, silver cups and additional cash awards. Competition in nearly all phases of farm life will be found. Cash prizes will go to winners for their work with farm mechanics, livestock, crops, home economics and other fields.

Security Card Does Not Alter Labor Law

Possession of Number by Children Explained in Story by Official

Possession of a social security card does not change any State child labor law, John J. Corson, Director of the Social Security Board's Bureau of Old-Age Insurance, cautions his Portland field office.

Some employers, according to reports reaching the Board's headquarters, have explained the illegal hiring of children by taking it for granted that the applicant for work had met State requirements because he had a social security card. Since the registration for old-age insurance began late in 1936, approximately 150,000 persons below the age of 16 have received account numbers.

The wage account is for use in connection with the eventual determination of the amount of old-age insurance to which the wage earner will be entitled when he reaches age 65 or dies. These same account numbers are also used in administering State unemployment compensation laws."
