Public Works Program Plan Needs Action

Portland Office Urges Cities to Hurry if Benefits Wanted

With less than sixty working days remaining in which applications for PWA funds for the construction of public works may be filed, cities and towns wishing to participate in the new Public Works program for national recovery were urged by Regional Director C. C. Hockley to lose no time in presenting their needs to the Public Works Administration.

Under provisions of the 1938 PWA Act, applications must be filed with the Public Works Administration not later than midnight, September 30, to receive consideration. Work on the projects must be started prior to January 1, 1938, and must be substantially completed by June 30, 1940.

"The Public Works Administration is not 'selling' projects to localities," Director Hockley stated. "Plans for construction projects must be drafted by representatives of public bodies in the various localities and presented to the PWA regional office in a formal application."

Hazards at Crossing May Be Eliminated

Road hazards along Oregon highways can be greatly lessened by legislation that will prohibit the erection or maintenance of any advertising signs within a radius of 500 feet of a railroad-highway crossing, a road or street and high intersection, or a short curve, it is declared in a report "Program for protection of Oregon Roadways," recently issued by the Oregon state planning board. The report, which is the work of the board's advisory committee on roadside protection strongly recommends passage of such legislation.

Highway advertising on danger points is already forbidden in many states, the report cites, and regulations of these states is included in detail in the study.

Mill, loading platforms, filling stations and other structures erected along highways should also be carefully regulated by the state highway commission, the report says. Legislation authorizing this regulation is also urged.

Other forms of advertising recognized as creating unusual road hazards are cited in the report as signs in series, reflectorized signs, and all types that attract by means of a moving part. "Such signs, if they are read by a driver, take his attention for too long a period," the committee declares.

Criticism is also directed toward illuminated signs displayed by businesses established along the highway. Regulation of the use of the color red, as well as other forms of illumination that distract drivers, is recommended.

Ladies of County Will Enjoy Camp

Lost Lake; Camp Onhalee to Be Mecca for Columbia County Women Said

Women of 20 Oregon counties will have an opportunity this year to attend the annual homemakers' vacation camps to be held in eight different locations throughout the state, according to the schedule just issued by Mrs. Azalea Sager, state leader of home economics extension at Oregon State college.

In addition, Mrs. Sager's staff is taking charge of six of the 4-H club camps to be conducted this year in Oregon, principally for the benefit of those clubbers who were unable to attend the annual club summer school at Corvallis in June.

Hundreds of women are enrolling for the homemakers' camps, according to home demonstration agents and county agents who are taking the registrations. The camps are, as usual, designed to offer women who are kept busy throughout the rest of the year with families and household tasks, a few days of rest and recreation, with opportunities for new interests, new interests, new friendships and new inspiration. The camps are com-

pletely staffed with paid helpers, so that the women have no tasks but to make up their own cots, yet costs are kept to the minimum and can be paid partly in farm produce. The women's camps cost an average of \$1 a day per person, and the club camps slightly less.

The first homemakers' camp this year will be the Josephine county camp at Oak Flats, July 24 to 27. This will be followed by a camp at Long Bow for women of Benton, Linn, Yamhill and Marion counties July 27 to 31; the Klamath-Jackson camp at Lake of the Woods, July 31 to August 6; the Lane, Coos, Curry and Douglas county camp, with women from Polk and Lincoln counties participating, at Lake Cleowax, August 2 to 7; the Wasco-Hood River camp, with a few women also from Columbia county, at Lost Lake, August 3 to 7; Columbia and Clackamas counties at Camp Onhalee August 10 to 14.
