Visits Son—

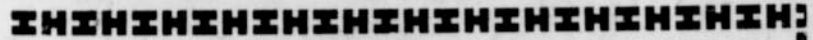

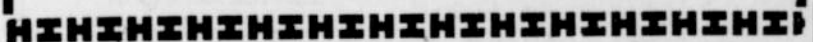

FARMING—A 2% transaction tax is a tax on farmer's gross receipts from all sales, including eggs, wheat, flax, livestock, vegetables; also a tax on everything he buys, —machinery, sacks, fertilizer, boxes, insurance, etc.

RETAIL—A 2% transaction tax is a tax on dollar value of all sales, large or small. The merchant is supposed to pay the tax. If he adds the tax to his prices, he can add MORE than the tax, thereby fooling the purchaser.

WHOLESALE—A 2% transaction tax is a tax on wholesale sales. Many retailers will buy outside Oregon, because interstate sales are exempt.

SERVICES of doctor, dentist, lawyer, accountant, garage repairman, are taxable. Lodge and club dues are taxable. Also rents received, interest, dividends, transportation charges, insurance premiums.

REAL ESTATE sales are taxed 2%.
