## Eagle Items Of Past Years

### FIVE YEARS AGO—

A registration shift from Republican to Democratic affiliations was indicated in a report from Mrs. E. H. Washburn who has had charge of registration books. Democrats registered numbered 119, Republicans 48, Socialists 4 and Independents 1.

Carl E. Davidson was announced as winner of a prize contest open to law students of the University of Oregon.

W. A. Davis of the Portland-Vernonia truck line has purchased a new truck to operate on the run. The old truck registered 55,000 miles in the 20 months of its operation.

### TEN YEARS AGO—

C. C. VanDoren, Rock creek farmer, brought a large egg to The Eagle office. The egg, produced by a Rhode Island Red hen, measured nine inches in diameter and weighed four and one-quarter ounces.

Lee Schwab was promoted to the position of editor of The Eagle by Mark E. Moe, publisher. Schwab had been with the staff of the paper three months before the promotion.

### FIFTEEN YEARS AGO—

## The Forum

Note: The following article was prepared for a class assignment by Joy Willard. The subject matter reveals some of the effects derived from the smoking of marijuana.

Marijuana is a bush first grown in India, later to spread through Persia, around the Mediterranean, then to be carried to South America, Central America, Mexico and finally to the United States.

The bush grows in height from three to 10 feet and has three, five and seven leaves on one stem. The plant, at one time, was chewed but more recently has been ground and placed into smoking tobacco, cigars and cigarettes. It has been known to have grown near Vernonia.

The effect of marijuana is more serious than any other drug known. With the first cigarette the person receives a sensation supposedly similar to heaven. The person generally likes it so well that he takes several more cigarettes. These generally drive him insane with chance for cure very little. The time to break the habit is at the time of smoking the first cigarette, a very strong will power being necessary even then. About the only method of cure is to be locked in a room without the drug until the desire is lost.

Several doses bring to the person the desire to kill as for example: A girl had used some of the drug, wanted more but lacked money for purchasing. A robbery resulted.

Another girl had taken considerable of the dope, went to her home to tell her mother of an invitation to a party. Her mother informed her to return home at a certain time. The girl was enraged to the extent of attempting to kill her mother and threatened to kill the rest of the family. Another case is that of a boy who wanted money for marijuana and almost killed his father to obtain it.



A survey of laws effecting motor vehicles and their operation, introduced at this year's session of the legislature, discloses that some important new measures were written into the books, while other legislation fell by the wayside before the expiration of the 20-day period.

granted to the governor for considering bills following the close of the legislature.

Passed were a bill requiring the examination of all automobile operators at four-year intervals, beginning in 1943; a bill changing many details of the automobile code and a third bill requiring pedestrians to observe traffic signals in the same manner as motor vehicles. Also successful was a bill enabling the owners of trucks and busses which are destroyed, retired from service or sold out of the state to transfer their registration to other vehicles similarly used. A dozen lesser measures, making minor changes or additions to the law, were also passed.

Chief casualties were a speed bill which would have set a maximum speed of 50 miles per hour on all the state's roads, but giving the state highway commission authority to raise or lower this limit on given stretches of highway in accordance with the nature and condition of the highway; and the state automobile inspection bill, which would have authorized the state highway commission to provide inspection of all motor vehicles in the state.

The new driver's examination law will require all drivers to be reexamined every four years just as new drivers are now examined, in order to check their vision, knowledge of law and driving ability. The examination may be taken at any time within the next four years at the option of the driver, but

must be passed before June 30th, 1943.

The two chief changes in the new headlight code will require drivers to dim their headlights at all times when approaching within 500 feet of other vehicles at night, and to

have their headlights turned on from a half hour after sunset to a half hour before sunrise, and whenever there is insufficient light to make visible a person 500 feet away, rather than 200 feet away, as at present.

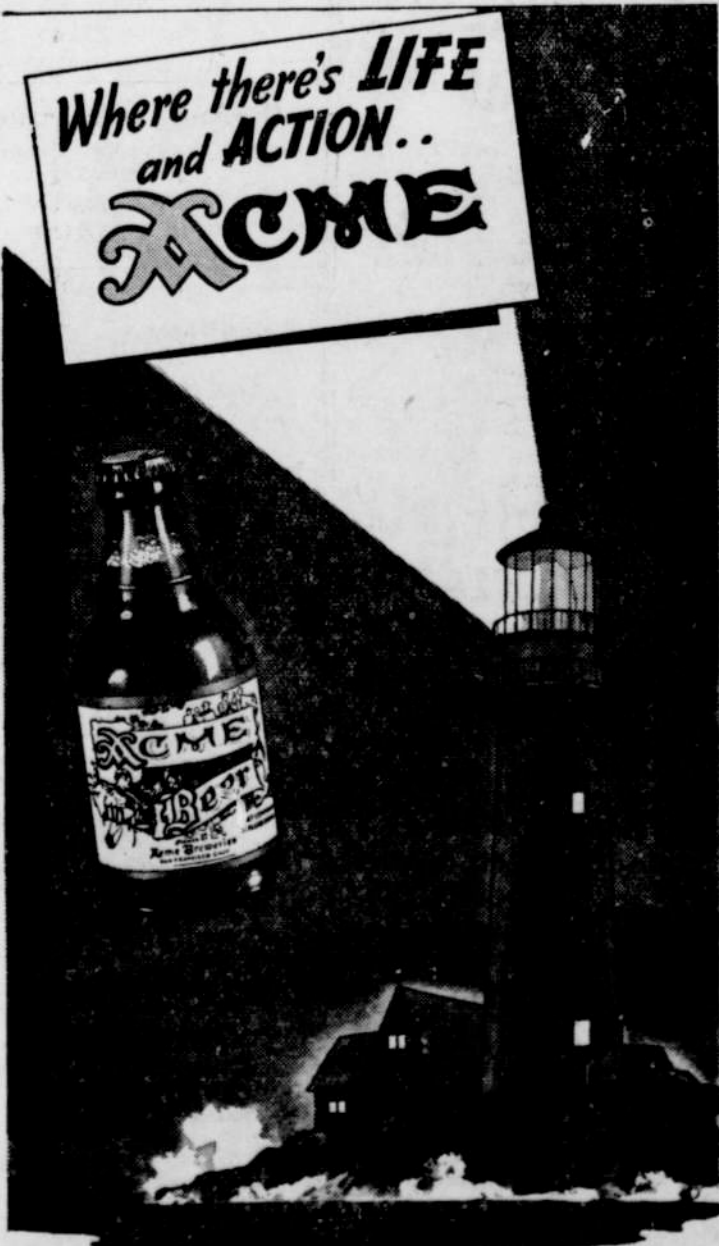
