

Model T Ford Race Scheduled

St. Helens Swim Pool Committee to Stage Event September 10

Martin Burlingame, chairman of the St. Helens swimming pool committee, via a telephone call to The Eagle Wednesday evening announced the scheduling of a Model T Ford race on September 10 at St. Helens. The race is open to anyone wishing to enter who has possession of that model car, it was stated.

The race will consist of 100 laps on a half-mile track to make a total distance for the race of 50 miles. An entry fee of two dollars is being charged and prizes will be awarded first, second and third place winners. Entry blanks may be obtained by writing to the chairman at St. Helens.

In the announcement it was stated that anyone in Vernonia wishing to enter could do so by making the proper contact.

3 Contracts Awarded by County Court

Approval Given by Public Works Administration for Equipment

The award of three contracts by the Columbia County Court for equipment required for the new jail addition to the courthouse at St. Helens, which is substantially completed, has been approved by the Public Works Administration.

The three contracts, totaling \$355, were awarded as follows: H. L. Schlink company, Portland, inter-office telephone system, listening-in device and police radio, \$304; Eastman Kodak Stores, Inc., Portland, mugging camera and fingerprint camera, \$191; Ormandy Brothers, St. Helens, office chairs, \$50.

The two-story jail addition, constructed at a cost of \$34,700, including equipment and minor alterations to the courthouse building, was financed in part with a PWA grant of \$15,045. All construction work on the building has been completed, with the exception of some finishing work to be done after the installation of equipment.

The Columbia county jail is one of 19 municipal buildings constructed by Oregon communities with the aid of funds allotted by the Public Works Administration under the 1938 PWA Appropriation Act. A majority of these buildings have been completed, well in advance of the scheduled completion date.

Exhibits at County Fair Said Largest

Clubs from Nehalem Valley Gain Recognition for Judging, Exhibits

In the 4-H field and Livestock club field this year marked the largest number of exhibits ever shown at the Columbia County Fair with 93 animals in the cattle division, 10 exhibits of sheep, goats and dogs, two rabbits, three pens of poultry, 17 forestry exhibits and six flower exhibits. Club exhibits from the Nehalem valley rated high mention according to George A. Nelson, County Agent.

The Beaver Creek Livestock Judging team tied for first place and will represent Columbia county at the Pacific International Livestock Exposition. This team consists of Jack McDonald who scored 370 points, while Billy Crawford, Ralph McDonald and Betty Crawford all tied with a score of 340 points each. As a team consists of but three members, an additional contest is being arranged to work off the tie.

Mr. Johnson pointed out that farmers who received notification of wheat allotments now have a 15-day period in which to make written appeals to the county committee, asking adjustment, if they are dissatisfied. The appeal must state reasons for wishing the adjustment.

Dates for the appeal in Columbia county are August 23 to September 6, inclusive.

During this same 15-day period, farmers who grew no wheat for harvest during 1937, 1938 or 1939, but intend to grow some for harvest in 1940, who make written application for wheat allotments. A limited reserve from the county's total wheat allotment has been set aside for establishing allotments on new wheat farms.

Special pick-ups from various parts of the grounds have also been arranged this year, including the banquet of the Oregon Purebred Livestock Association.
