

Members of the Vernonia Study Club met last Thursday afternoon at the home of Mrs. J. W. Nichols. A delicious luncheon was served by the hostess.


Each member of the club responparty will start with a luncheon ded to roll call by naming her avorite opera and giving the reason for the choice.
