These federal insurance payments, Peebles explained, should not be confused with the state law in behalf of needy dependent children. Federal payments are made as a matter of right, and not based upon need, and can be paid only if the deceased worker's employment record shows that he has met the requirements of the social security

Workers in jobs covered by the ederal law have a social security account card. They contribute one per cent of their wages or salaries and the employer pays an equal amount.


